Lodge Officers To Be Honored

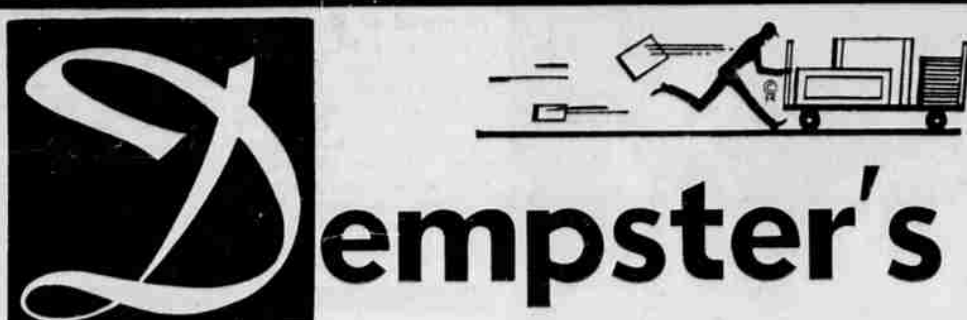
