

Aldrich Letters Given to Library

Eugene — The correspondence of Edwin B. Aldrich, former editor and publisher of the Pendleton East Oregonian, has been placed in the University of Oregon library by Mrs. Aldrich of Pendleton. Much of the correspondence, extending from 1906 to 1934, deals with the development of the Columbia river as a source of power. Aldrich, who died in 1950, was recognized as a leading proponent and organizer of measures that led to construction of McNary Dam. The file also contains many letters relating to political matters, both in Oregon and on the national scene. Major letter groups represent such names as Charles McNary, George Chamberlain, Frederick Steiwer, and William G. McAdoo. The collection represents, said librarian Carl W. Hintz, a major addition to the library's growing resources in the area of recent economic and political history, particularly relating to the Columbia river.

Salem Attorney Released on Bail

Salem — UP — Salem Attorney William Dobson, 41, is free on \$5,000 bail after being arrested Saturday on a charge of embezzlement by guardianship. Dobson was indicted by a Marion County grand jury and taken into custody at his Mt. Hood summer home. He won a reduction of bond from \$10,000 Saturday afternoon. Marion county authorities say the charge involves illegal expenditure of \$81,000 belonging to an 83-year-old Klamath Indian, Asa T. Miller of Klamath Falls. Dist. Atty. Hattie Kremen said Miller received \$36,000 under the Klamath Termination act and another \$45,000 from the estate of a daughter. As guardian, Dobson was supposed to spend \$500 a month for Miller's care, Mrs. Kremen said. The indictment charges all the money was spent in the past year and that \$19,000 of it was embezzled by Dobson. A joint investigation by Mrs. Kremen and the Oregon State Bar led to the indictment.

Boy Injured in Auto Accident Sunday

Theodore Irvin Bennett, 14, of 315 Lozier lane, was in fairly good condition this morning at Rogue Valley hospital following a one-car accident on the Jacksonville highway, a half-mile west of Jacksonville yesterday. According to state police, the car, driven by Robert Ray Redding, 16, of 363 Laurel st., Ashland, was traveling east on the old portion of the Jacksonville highway when it failed to make a right curve. Both boys were taken to the Mitchell Sanatorium in Jacksonville by a passing motorist then transferred to the hospital by the Medford Ambulance Service. Redding was treated for minor injuries and released.

Columbia River Boat Basin Dedicated

Hood River — UP — Ceremonies were held aboard the 300-foot Navy attack transport USS Weiss Sunday dedicating the Columbia River Boat Basin here. Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) praised the people of Hood River and the city's port commission for their efforts in seeing the project through. Assistant Navy Secretary Kenneth BeLieu, a former Oregonian, also spoke. Skipper of the Weiss, which was to leave today for California, is Lt. Cmdr. M. D. Tuel, a former resident of Wasco.

NEW HEADQUARTERS

Vatican City — UP — Pope John XXIII called Sunday for a new headquarters for the diocese of Rome in the vicinity of the Basilica of St. John Lateran. The pontiff visited the Basilica on the feast of St. John the Baptist. He said the centralization of the diocese offices was necessary because "this is no longer the Rome of 60 years ago when it had 400,000 inhabitants, but a city which passes the 2,000,000 mark."

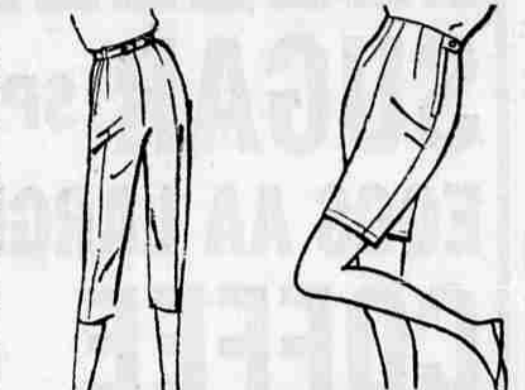
