

National Service Life Insurance May Be Reopened

Washington — House and Senate leaders and the Budget Bureau have reached an agreement for early congressional action to let World War II and Korean War veterans reinstate lapsed GI insurance or take out new policies.

A roadblock against passage of a \$100 million cost-of-living increase in service-connected compensation payments also was removed.

Both pieces of legislation are given a good chance of final passage.

Bills Deadlocked

The insurance and compensation bills had been deadlocked between the House and the Senate. The House has voted several times to increase service-connected compensation payments, and the Senate also has approved it but with an amendment to allow reopening of National Service Life Insurance.

The administration has stood firm against the NSLI reopening on the ground that it was not justified. As a result both bills were stymied.

The Budget Bureau and the Veterans Administration advised Congress Wednesday that the administration would agree to an insurance reopening bill provided certain changes are made.

Service Dates Listed

Under the proposed compromise any veteran of military service between Oct. 8, 1940, and Dec. 31, 1956, provided he is now out of the service, could reinstate, or take out for the first time, up to \$10,000 in National Service Life Insurance.

Of the nearly 20 million men who were in service during that period, only about 5.6 million still carry their GI policies. The Veterans Administration estimates that about one million more would take advantage of the new privilege.
