CHARLES J. NUNAN - Ventura, Calif. - Charles J. Nunan, son of a pioneer Jacksonville family, died here June 26 at his home. He had lived in Ventura for 40 years.

A native of Jacksonville, Mr. Nunan attended school there before enrolling at Santa Clara university in California. He was an ardent baseball fan and was a member of early-day Jacksonville teams.

Mr. Nunan's mercantile store in Jacksonville was one of the largest and best known. The family home built by his parents still stands on Old Stage rd. He later farmed the area now known as the Heuner farm near Jacksonville.

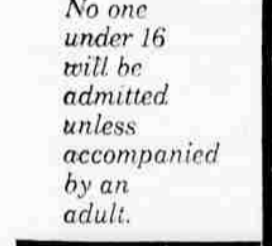
