Defiant Convicts Expected To Give Way To Hunger

Protesters—(UPI)—The defiant convicts holding out for a water house in Western Correctional Institution in prison, expected to give way to hunger today.

With a hot, sunny day and temperatures in the 90s forecast, prison officials predicted the rebels would give up and come down from the catwalk of the water tower 8 feet above the prison yard.

Three Come Down
So far, three of the original 13 have cracked under the strain of thirst and hunger. One came down Thursday and two the previous day.

William Zieff, 21, gave up against the mounting odds in mid-afternoon Thursday and climbed down a ladder into the waiting arms of guards. Zieff, serving 9 months to 2 years for armed robbery, would have served his minimum term on July 30.

He was rushed to the prison hospital where authorities said he was suffering from dehydration.

The two who gave up Wednesday, James J. Fletcher, 25, and Alfred Nardi Jr., left the hospital Thursday. They were sent to the prison's disciplinary section, which was the cause of the protest demonstration.

'Hole' Defended
Although the section is known to the inmates as "the hole," Warden James F. Maroney said it is far from that. He said prisoners confined there receive regular meals but lose their privileges such as movies and television.

Robert Payne, 29, was being transferred from the hospital back to the disciplinary cellblock Monday when he broke away from his guards and made for the tower.

When he reached the catwalk, he shouted down to newsmen that he would stay there until an investigation was made of the "inhuman and brutal" treatment inmates underwent in "the hole."

Instant Decision

A Bug's Brain Outdoes Our Fastest Computer

We could hardly credit it with having a brain at all; it's merely a bump, or an enlargement in a nerve, yet in the body of a very lowly creature is a computer that out-computes the best man ever made, and all in the brain of a bug.

In the bug's body, its computer is ultra-high-speed, can make accurate decisions in a fraction of the time and with out a single electronic tube, wheel, spool, or switch. In comparison with our fastest computer, the bug-brain makes ours pitifully slow, and actually inefficient. We're not even playing in the same league.

Not only does the bug have to make rapid calculations, but it must also put the information into action; its reflexes must be as fast as its computations. Snap-judgments are imperative to the survival of a living creature. To eat, or to escape its enemies, it must always be ready to make counter adjustments to fit the occasion; its reactions must be as instantaneous as its decision to act.

PRESIDENT SIGNS BILL
Washington—(UPI)—President Kennedy Thursday signed a bill extending for another year about \$4 billion in federal excise and corporate taxes and eliminating the 10 per cent tax on train and bus fares. It also reduces to 5 per cent the tax on airline tickets.

Peruvian Army Moves To Upset Election Result

Lima, Peru—(UPI)—The army moved Thursday night to block the presidential chances of Victor R. Haya de la Torre, government-backed winner of an indecisive victory in the June 10 election.

An army announcement charged "grave irregularities" in the voting in seven provinces—all Haya strongholds—and it appeared that military leaders might try to nullify the election.

Intervention Hailed
Fernando Belaunde Terry, the army-backed candidate nosed out by Haya in the election, hailed the military intervention. Ex-President Manuel Odría, who placed third in the election, sided with Haya.

With only 1,000 votes remaining to be counted, official returns showed that Haya won the election, with 557,524 votes to 543,322 for Belaunde and 481,039 for Odría.

Four splinter candidates, none of whom received as many as 50,000 votes, soaked up enough of the total to prevent any of the front-runners from receiving the 33.33 per cent of the vote needed for decisive victory. Haya received only 32.97 per cent of the total.

Congress To Choose
That throws the election into the new Congress, which is to meet July 28 to choose a president from among the three front-runners in the election.

PLEDGES \$150,000
New York—(UPI)—An initial pledge of \$150,000 toward the construction of a new theater at Columbia University was announced Thursday in behalf of composer Richard Rodgers at a luncheon given in honor of his 60th birthday. The money will come from the Rodgers and Hammerstein Foundation formed several years ago by the composer and his late collaborator, Oscar Hammerstein.

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Salem Television Request Dropped

Washington—(UPI)—Chief Hearing Examiner James D. Cunningham of the Federal Communications Commission Thursday granted a petition by Willamette-Land Television, Inc. for dismissal of its application for a new station to operate on Channel 3, Salem, Ore.

The action is final except in unusual cases. Cunningham dismissed the application with prejudice, however, which meant that the firm could not apply again for a license to operate in that area for one year.

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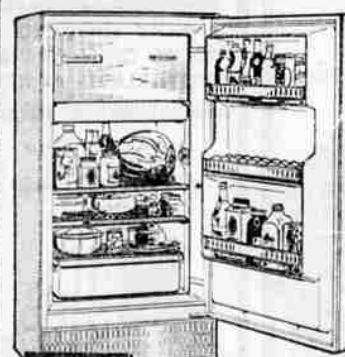
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
