Lightner Retiring

Salem —UPI— Veteran referee Al Lightner said today he is retiring from big-time basketball officiating.

Lightner has been reported quitting for the past several years, but this time it was made official by Bernie Hamerbeck, head of the Pacific Intercollegiate Officiating Bureau (PIOB).

Hammerbeck announced the resignation from the PIOB of both Lightner and commissioner Lloyd Leith of San Francisco.

"I wasn't going to say a word about it this year," Lightner said. "I was just hoping that next season everyone would say, 'Where's old Al?' And old Al would just say 'Oh, he quit after last year.'"

Lightner is 47 years old. "Refereeing is for young men," Lightner said. "I'm not getting any younger."

A former professional baseball player and the sports editor of the Oregon Statesman here, Lightner has been whistling major college basketball games for 17 years.

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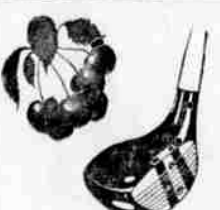
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
