Tennis Classes Under Way in City

Instructional classes in tennis and baton twirling, part of the Medford park and recreation department's summer program, are under way and will continue until August, department officials have announced.

Tennis classes for both boys and girls have been arranged at the beginners, intermediate and advanced levels, and are held on courts at Medford High school and McLaughlin and Herdick Junior High schools.

Students are asked to provide their own rackets, shoes and appropriate clothing, but tennis balls are furnished by the department. A fee of \$1 is charged for beginners, and a \$2 fee is charged the advanced students.

Vacancies still exist in classes for all three levels of ability, and interested youngsters may obtain more information by telephoning or going to the park and recreation department office on the main floor of city hall.

Baton classes for beginners, instructed by Miss Dayle Nesheim, have been scheduled at Howard, Jefferson, and Washington schools and at Jackson and Hawthorne parks. A class for advanced students will be scheduled at a later date.

Scenic Group To Ponder Gorge Plan

Portland—UP—The Oregon Scenic Area Commission has decided to mull a while longer over whether to create an 80-mile area along the Columbia River Gorge.

The commission held final hearings Thursday on the proposal for a billboard-free stretch between the Sandy River and Old Celilo Falls.

The commission has 30 days to rule on the petition from the Columbia River Gorge Commission. Hearings are planned in August on two proposed scenic areas along the coast.

Coos Bay Doctor Loses in Election

Chicago—UP—An Oregon doctor who was a candidate for the American Medical Association presidency lost Thursday to a doctor noted for fighting President Kennedy's medicare plan.

Dr. Edward R. Annis, Miami, chairman of the AMA's national speakers bureau, became the first president-elect in more than 40 years who did not rise through the ranks of the house of delegates.

He was chosen over Dr. Raymond McKeown, Coos Bay, AMA secretary-treasurer and trustee.

Dr. Annis became known during the past year as the AMA's spokesman in the dispute with the Kennedy administration proposal to provide medical care for the aged under social security.

He said he did not seek the AMA office. He said he was elected because he had truly reflected "the views of the doctors of this country."
