Entry Permits To Be Required In Forest Areas

Salem—UPB—State Forester Dwight Phipps Thursday announced that due to high fire danger entry permits will be required as of July 1 in six areas of Oregon.

Also announced were regulated closure conditions in 12 national forests in the state, meaning a visitor doesn't need an entry permit but must comply with special rules such as not smoking while traveling in a vehicle, and the required packing of certain equipment. The six areas where entry permits from a state or federal fire warden will be required are: Summer Lake rim, the western side of the lake, in Lake county; south fork of the Clackamas river, Clackamas county; Corvallis watershed area in Benton county; Eckman mountain area in western Lincoln county; Cape Creek area, western Lane county; and Wood Road No. 1 area, southwest of Bend, Deschutes county.
