Spahn Wins 316th; Giants Top Phils

By United Press International. Lefthander Warren Spahn of the Milwaukee Braves broke a four-game losing streak with the help of newly acquired reliever Claude Raymond to beat the Chicago Cubs Saturday, 5-3, for the 316th win of his career.

The 43-year-old Spahn had a shutout and a five-hitter until the eighth when the Cubs belted him out with three runs on four hits. Raymond, purchased from Toronto Thursday, squelched the rally and put down the Cubs in order in the ninth.

Felipe Alou drove in four runs with a pair of homers while the San Francisco Giants hung onto first place by facing the Philadelphia Phillies 8-3.

Alou powered his first of the game off loser Cal McLish (5-2) with the bases empty in the fourth inning.

Angels Finally Beat Yanks at New York

By United Press International. Reliever Dean Chance came out of the bullpen to quell an eight-inning rally Saturday and preserve a 5-3 Los Angeles victory over New York — the Angels' first win ever at Yankee stadium.

The 21-year-old Chance, working for the fifth time in the last seven games, took over for starter Ted Bowsfield after Roger Maris' 15th homer cut the Los Angeles Margin to two runs. With Bobby Richardson on via a walk, Chance also passed Mickey Mantle but then struck out Hector Lopez and Bill Skowron to end the threat.

The Angels, who lost all 11 games here last year, won two more this season, sandwiched four singles around a strikeout in the opening frame for their first two runs and then knocked out Daley on three extra base hits and a single by little Albie Pearson.

Rollins, Cepeda Top All-Star Vote Getters

New York — (UPI) — Third-baseman Rich Rollins of the Minnesota Twins and slugging first baseman Orlando Cepeda of the San Francisco Giants were honored with the greatest support today when the starting lineups for this year's major league All-Star games were announced.

Rollins, led the American League voting with 184 votes to 182 for center fielder Mickey Mantle of the New York Yankees while Cepeda, one of three "repeaters" from last year's National League team, topped teammate Willie Mays in the senior circuit voting, 229 to 213.

The starting lineups for the two games, July 10 in Washington and July 30 in Chicago, were selected in voting by the players themselves and announced by baseball Commissioner Ford Frick. A total of 280 votes were cast in the American League and 290 were cast in the National.

Falcons Trip Studs In Legion Baseball; Tiffs Billed Today

Memorial Field, White City — Klamath Falls Falcons, benefitting from a four-run sixth inning splurge, trimmed the Central Point Cheney Studs 6 to 2 Friday evening in an American Legion junior baseball game to move into a tie for second place in the Southern division of Area 4.

The Falcons and Studs share the knot with 3-2 records each.

Klamath's scoring in the sixth broke a 2-all deadlock. The runs came on three hits, two errors and a base on balls. Pitcher Marv Edwards helped his own and the Falcons' cause with three runs batted in, two in the sixth. He hurled six-hit ball with 10 strikeouts and five bases on balls.

Medford Cokes will attempt to fortify their Southern division lead and Central Point Cheney Studs will try to resume second place alone in American Legion junior baseball games today.

Medford will meet Klamath's Hawks in a 12:30 p.m. twinball at Klamath Falls. The Studs will have a doubleheader at Grants Pass beginning at 1:30 p.m. Only the first games will count in the standings.

Bill Enyart and Jack Forde are expected to do the pitching for Medford. Mike Pepper and Larry Mason are ticketed for mound service for Central Point.

Medford will encounter the Klamath Falls Falcons on Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. at White City.

Central Point's Studs challenged the Falcons in three innings when they had the bases filled, once with no one out. But, the Cheney nine could not muster the punch to capitalize sufficiently.

Klamath put together Sherm Allen's hit and stolen base with two Stud errors for a run in the first stanza. CP came right back to tie the score in the bottom of the frame when Pat Pepper singled and reached second base on a passed ball and Jeff Anhorn singled him home.

Two walks then filled the sacks and the count went to three balls and no strikes. Edwards got Halasa to fan, however, for the third out.

Dave Saks was credited with a double in the second panel when outfielder Paul Branson lost his high fly in the lights. Edwards singled him home for KF's second tally.

Anhorn also drove in CP's second marker. Larry Pepper was safe on an error. Mike Glines walked and Pat Pepper singled to load the bases. Lou Alvarez whiffed for the first out. Two walks and a Howard Tomlinson hit filled up the bases for the Studs in the sixth inning with two away. Pat Pepper forced Tomlinson at third base to end the game. Central Point Pitcher Larry Pepper outdid Edwards with more strikeouts and fewer bases on balls. He fanned 12 and walked but three in a seven-inning.

Anhorn and Pat Pepper each had two hits for Central Point as had Edwards for the Falcons. Dick Halasa of Cheney whammed the best hit of the game, a triple some 400 feet into right field. It was a blow he doubtless wished he could have traded for his first inning batting turn.

Early Wynn pitched a five-hitter to earn the Chicago White Sox a 7-0 victory over the Cleveland Indians and Chalk up the 296th win of his major league career.
