Allowable Timber Cut on BLM Lands In State Increased

Portland - The annual allowable timber cut from bureau of land management lands in western Oregon has been raised by 26 million board feet, John A. Carver Jr., assistant secretary of the interior, has announced. The revised annual allowable cut for Jackson county is 86,000,000 board feet; Josephine county, 129,000,000; and Klamath county, 23,000,000. The increased allowable timber harvest on BLM lands is based on the latest available inventory data. It can provide the equivalent of some 300 additional man-years of local employment, Carver said. This raises the total annual allowable cut on western Oregon lands managed by BLM to 977 million board feet. Carver explained that this total includes the combined allowable cuts for the O&C grant lands, the Coos Bay Wagon road grant lands, and intermingled public domain lands. Lands Jointly Managed The lands are jointly managed for sustained timber production and are generally lumped into one category and referred to as the O&C forest. These lands managed by BLM are all outside the national forest system. Timber sales on O&C lands during 1961 amounted to almost 1 billion board feet, valued at more than \$26 million. Seventy-five per cent of the revenues from O&C grant lands go to the counties in which the lands are located. Twenty-five per cent goes in the U.S. treasury, he noted. This is the 10th such increase since 1937 when the allowable cut was 500 million board feet and in 1962 the total is 977 million including public domain lands.
