

Architects Do Not Want Free Reins in Plans

New York (UPI)—An architect does not want absolutely free rein in his planning.

Complete license in an assignment will not bring out the best in an architect. Some measure of control is desirable. The discipline of convincing a client of the merit of his plans will help the planner to think out his project. These words— from one of New York's leading architects, Richard Roth of Emery Roth & Son— should help dispel any lingering impression of the architect as a free spender (with the client's money) dreamer (this dreamer).

As an indication of this new attitude, Roth pointed to the recent provision in urban renewal administration manual permitting architectural consultation as an eligible cost in a rehabilitation project.

In the past, Roth said, renewal and esthetic improvement have not always gone hand in hand. Now, however, with cities tending to combine "pocket" renewal, stressing rehabilitation and restoration, with the traditional demolish-and-rebuild approach, preservation of much of the charm, variety, and esthetic values as reflected in the architecture of older downtown areas should ensue.

Since September, when the clause was formalized, more than 20 cities of all sizes have taken advantage of it, either by directly employing architects as permanent staff men of renewal agencies or by retaining architectural firms for consultation services, Roth said.

Roth's own firm is working on redevelopment projects in New York, Boston, Hartford and Baltimore and it has done much to reshape Manhattan's postwar skyline.

Formerly, the architect observed, rehabilitation operated piecemeal, with builder, craftsman and materials supplier determining improvements on a building-by-building basis.

"Many sound structures were saved by this method but, without the esthetic guidance which only an architect can contribute, the overall result for a given area often was a hodgepodge lacking any esthetic relationship between neighboring buildings, and hence devoid of the artistic unity vital to beautification," Guide Work.

In such cities as New York, Newark, N.J.; Boston, New Haven, Conn.; Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Chicago, Louisville, Cincinnati, Denver and San Francisco; in Pittston and Wilkes-Barre, Pa.; Mount Holly, N.J.; Jackson and Mount Clemens, Mich.; Dayton, Toledo and Springfield, Ohio; and in Waterloo, Iowa and Atchison, Kan., architects are now guiding rehabilitation work.

Recently, also, a joint committee was formed by the public housing administration and the American Institute of Architects through which the architects will advise on all areas of design in public housing.

This spirit of cooperation, Roth observed, is apparent also among individual architects and architectural firms. "If a client should come to me to design a shopping center, for instance," Roth said, "I undoubtedly would suggest he go to another firm which specializes in such work, or else ask that he allow me to bring them in as consultants on the job."

Senators To Tour Bases in Europe

Washington (UPI)—A team of Senate investigators will tour U.S. military bases in Europe this month to check widespread complaints of mismanagement of military justice.

The investigators, representing the Senate Constitutional Rights subcommittee, will leave this week end on a two-week fact-finding mission to Army and Air Force bases in West Germany, France and possibly Great Britain.

Among other things, the investigators will reopen an earlier inquiry into reports that troops in France were threatened with reprisals if they did not volunteer for a Darryl F. Zanuck war movie.

Complaints accumulated by the subcommittee range all the way from "stacked" courts martial to a private's allegation that he was sent to a mental hospital when he could not immediately master his clerkly duties.
