

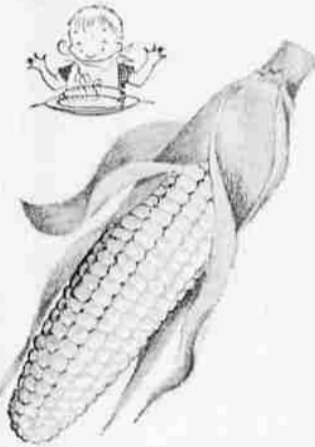
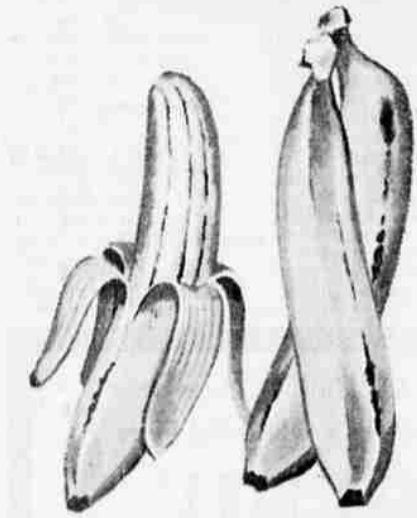

Small Worlds Around Us

Out of Place Organs Seem To Work All Right
Nature seems pretty consistent for the most part by putting common and functional organs in conventional locations in the bodies of living animals.

We expect teeth to be in a creature's mouth, ears on the head, heart and lungs in a body cavity, and eyes, nose and mouth in the face. In the great majority of animals they are there, in their proper places. There are, however, notable exceptions.

And it's amazing, but the odd-placed organs in peculiarly-built animals work perfectly. Ordinarily we presume that the mouth is the only logical place for teeth, but there are many species of creatures which confuse this by having teeth in the throat or even in the stomach. The ocean drum, a common salt water fish, is an example.

The drum loves oysters, so it partly swallows the oysters, shell and all, and the teeth in the throat crush the shells as the fish swallows the soft oysters and spits out the shells. It's just like a small boy ejecting the seeds of a watermelon.

Teeth in Throat
The manta-ray, a much depressed fish of tremendous size, also carries its teeth back in the throat. The common crawfish, which isn't a fish at all, has its teeth in its stomach. The sand dollar, starfish and sea urchin have teeth in the body proper. If these teeth are worn out or dislodged, it is of no concern. More teeth grow in to replace the lost ones.

Alongside these marine creatures lives the scallop. This mollusk swims by rapidly opening and closing the two valves of the shells. The creature has eyes on the body, right along the edge of the mantle. The starfish, has eyes at the ends of its arms; an ordinarily unlikely place for eyes.

And then consider the porpoise. When noses were passed around, he was put to lunch. So Mother Nature compensated by equipping the porpoise with a hole in the top of the head. To keep the water out, a clever little trap-door opens and closes. It works silently and smoothly; closes when the porpoise goes under the water, opens when the top of the head comes above the water. In the meantime, the animal merely holds its breath. But it is used to that, so there is no problem.

Mrs. Katydid, who sits hidden in the leaves of a tree and listens to her boy friend yelling, "She did, she didn't," hears what he says by means of ears located in her front legs.

As if that wasn't bad enough, consider the common housefly. It has its brain, what there is of it, right on the floor of the stomach.
