### Area Ministers Assist State, Town, Country Meeting

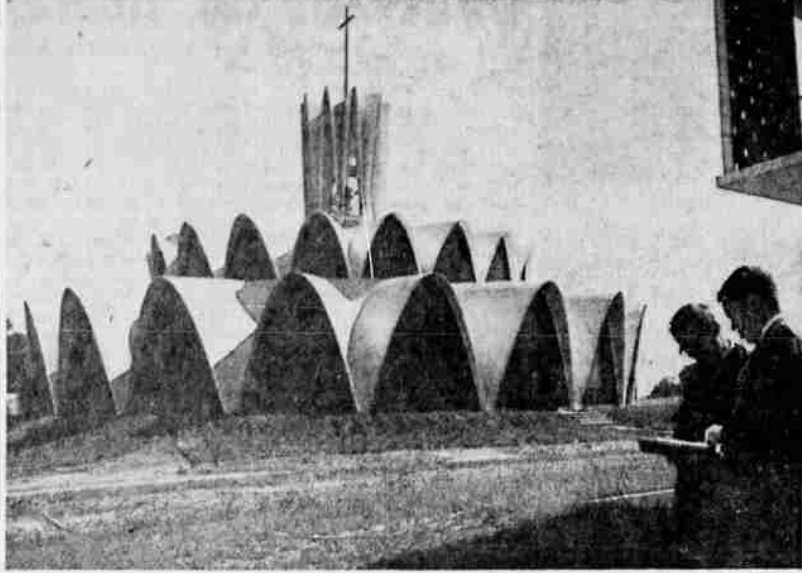
