

Medford Host Again To Junior Olympic Short Course Swim

Swimming spotlight will focus on Medford next week end.

For the second successive year this community will be the host for the Oregon AAU Junior Olympic Short Course Swimming Championships.

Races will be conducted in the city's Jackson pool. Girls' events are scheduled for Friday and boys' for Saturday. Preliminaries will be conducted each day at 10 a.m. with finals at 7 p.m.

Several hundred entrants are expected from numerous Oregon swimming organizations. Heaviest entry is foreseen from clubs of the Portland area. Medford, itself, will have a sizable entry.

Age Groups
Competition will be in four age groups each for boys and girls. These are 10 and under 11-12 years, 13-14 and 15-16.

The public is invited to witness the races. There will be bleachers at the pool. Ken Lyons, city recreation supervisor, said it is planned to provide better lighting.

The short course designation refers not to the length of the races but to the size of the pool. Jackson is a 25-yard facility.

New Yanks Chosen To AL Star Squad

Boston — (UPI) — A new generation of New York Yankees graduated into All-Star class today when Yankee manager Ralph Houk announced his pitching and reserve selections for the 1962 American League All-Star squad.

The champions continued their long domination of the All-Star squad balloting with six of the 25 players chosen for next Tuesday's first All-Star game at Washington.

Two "new Yankees" to All-Star selection, rookie infielder Tom Tresh and pitcher Ralph Terry, won squad berths along with established star veterans, Mickey Mantle and Roger Maris in the outfield, catcher Elston Howard, and infielder Bobby Richardson.

Berra, Ford Skipped
Two "old Yankees" displaced from long-time star berths in the balloting by the players and were outfielder-catcher Yogi Berra and pitcher Whitey Ford. Berra had been chosen for 14 consecutive seasons and Ford named in seven of the last nine years.

In addition to Terry, Houk chose six other right-handers and a lonely southpaw, Detroit's Hank Aguirre. The right-handers, picked in a bid to stem the power of the National League's all-rightie starting lineup, include Jim Bunning of Detroit, Dick Donovan of Cleveland, Bill Monbouquette of Boston, Camilo Pascual of Minnesota, rookie Dave Stenhouse of Washington, and Hoyt Wilhelm of Baltimore.

The American League starting lineup as established earlier by the voting includes Jim Gentile of Baltimore, Billy Moran of Los Angeles, Louis Aparicio of Chicago and yearling Rich Rollins of Minnesota around the infield, Maris, Mantle and Leon Wagner of Los Angeles in the outfield, and Minnesota's Earl Battey as catcher.

Houk exactly followed the player voting in choice of his reserves, picking runner-up to the starting selections right down the line. In his only variation, he added his own Howard to catching selections Battey and John Romano of Cleveland.

Reserve infielders include Norm Siebern of Kansas City, Richardson and Tresh of New York, and Brooks Robinson of Baltimore. Outfield spares are Rocky Colavito of Detroit, Jim Landis of Chicago, and Lee Thomas of Los Angeles.

Cokes Trim Studs 5-2 To Even Score; Teams Vie Monday

Memorial Field, White City — Medford American Legion junior baseball team garnered go ahead runs in the fifth inning and pitcher Bob King put frosting on the victory cake in the sixth canto Friday night when the Cokes decided the Central Point Cheney Studs 5 to 2 in a non-league scuffle here.

The Cokes tabulated twice in the top of the fifth for a 3 to 1 gap. Central Point came back with a single marker in the bottom of the frame. King, who also tossed a four-hitter for the Medford club, batted a two-run homer in the sixth.

The outcome evened Medford in season activity against the Cheney nine. They have met four times and each has won two games. Two more encounters are billed between these teams, both this week. Medford and Central Point collide in an Area 4 Southern division fray at the Veterans Administration 4 m i l l i a r y diamond at 7:30 p.m. on Monday. A Wednesday night battle, here again, will have no division bearing.

GP at KF Hawks

One league scrap is billed today with Grants Pass meeting the Klamath Falls Hawks at Klamath Falls. Medford (4-3), in second place leads Central Point and Grants Pass (each 3-3) by one-half game. Klamath Falls Falcons (4-2) are in front.

Monday's scrap will be the last in regular league action for the Medford Cokes. Central Point will face the Klamath Falls Hawks (1-4) Friday in the Studs' last scheduled loop test.

Singles by Dan Miles, Dick Deffley and Jim Calhoun gave Medford a first-inning run on Friday. Miles, first man up to the fracas, tallied on Calhoun's blow. Central Point tied it in the second panel on a single by Neil Ribenburg, second baseman Bob Schroeder's fielding miscue on a rap by Harold Allen and walks to Dick Halaas and Mike Pepper. King's pass to Pepper put Ribenburg across the plate.

Deffley Squeezes
Schroeder led off with a single in the fifth inning. King drew a base on balls and Schroeder ran to third after the catch on Miles' flyout. Deffley's sacrifice bunt squeezed Schroeder home. Don Anderson singled off the glove of Mike Pepper and Calhoun collected his second run batted in on a single that brought King in.

Mike Glines hit safely to start the bottom of the fifth for CP. He swiped second and got to third base on catcher Ken Phipps' bad throw. Glines scored on Pat Pepper's groundout.

For Medford in the sixth Gary Miller walked. He stole second and reached third when catcher Jeff Anhorn's heave to second was wide. King came up with two out and poked the ball close to 400 feet out in right field.

Caught at Home
Calhoun for Medford and Anhorn for the Cheney club each had two hits. Anhorn smashed the ball to deep right field for a three-base hit. He was out trying to make it all the way home. Schroeder fumbled the throw in from outfielder Calhoun but recovered the ball and relayed it in to Phipps to catch the Cheney runner.

King gave up six bases on balls to CP and fanned batters seven times. Mike Pepper in a seven-hitter walked four, hit one and whiffed six.

Medford threatened to score in the fourth inning when miscues by shortstop Lou Alvarez and Mike Pepper enabled Mike Neathamer to reach third base. The Medfordite, however, was caught in a rundown by catcher Anhorn and third baseman Glines. Anhorn caught one Medford runner trying to steal.

The Studs had the bases filled with two out in the sixth inning on two walks, a force out and King's bad throw to first. King fanned Alvarez to end the bid.

Denny Moyer Decisions Teddy Wright at Garden

New York — (UPI) — Middleweight contender Denny Moyer avenged his family honor Saturday night with repeated left jabs and straight rights to the head for a turntable unanimous decision over Teddy Wright in their second television fight at Madison Square Garden.

Baby-faced Moyer of Portland, Ore., not only came back to beat Wright of Detroit, who had won a split decision over Denny in the Garden, June 9; but Denny also avenged the defeat of brother Phil Moyer, who lost a unanimous decision to Wright in the same garden ring on May 26.

Moyer, favored at 2-1, and outweighing Wright, 157 1/2 pounds to 152, won the rounds votes of the three ring officials as follows: Referee Teddy Martin, 8-2; Judge Artie Aidala, 6-3-1; and Judge Johnny Dran, 7-3.

The United Press International had Moyer ahead, 7-2-2.
