

PCL All-Stars Play LA Angels Tonight

An unprecedented Pacific Coast league All-Star game arranged on the spur of the moment is expected to draw between 12,000 and 15,000 fans to Portland's Multnomah Stadium tonight.

The PCL stars take on the Los Angeles Angels of the American league, marking the first appearance ever by a major league club in a minor league all-star game.

PCL officials had planned a game along the traditional north vs. south lines at Tacoma or Salt Lake City this season, but then came the opportunity to play the Angels. The game was promptly shifted to Portland, partly because of spacious Multnomah Stadium and partly because baseball interest was lagging badly in the city.

The Angels will play without second baseman Bill Morgan and outfielders Leon Wagner and Lee Thomas. They played in the Major League All-Star game Tuesday in Washington.

Manager Bill Rigney plans to start a lineup of Jack Spring pitching, Bob Rodgers catching, Steve Bilko at first base, Joe Koppe at second, Jim Fregosi at short, Felix Torres at third, and Earl Averill, Albie Pearson and Tom Burgess in the outfield.

All-Star manager Don Heffner of San Diego hasn't announced a starting pitcher, but it may be Dick Egan of Hawaii, the league's winningest hurler with a 10-4 record.

Other all-star starters will be San Diego catcher Jesse Gonder, Salt Lake City first baseman Hal Jones, Spokane second baseman Nate Oliver, Salt Lake shortstop Jack Kubiszyn, San Diego third baseman Tom Harper, and outfielders Jay Hankins of Portland, Stan Palys of Hawaii and Ken Walters of San Diego.

In league play yesterday, slugging Tommy Harper and rookie pitcher John Flavin combined talents to give first place San Diego an 8-1 win over Hawaii.

The Padres clug to a 3 1/2 game bulge over second-place Salt Lake despite the Bees' 7-3 and 13-5 triumphs over Seattle.

Portland nipped Vancouver 5-4 and Tacoma blanked Spokane 11-0 in other games.

Harper, who at last counted the league both in average and homers, pounded his 19th and 20th circuit clouts of the season against Hawaii.

His last came in the second

with one aboard and the other three innings later with two aboard.

Flavin backed up this support with a six-hit job and had a shut-out working until the ninth when the Islanders scored their lone run.

Portland pulled a few heroes in the ninth to nip Vancouver. Shortstop Jim Hughes singled in Gordon MacKenzie with one marker and the Beavers added the eventual decider when Charlie Serrest's double scored pinch-runner Mickey Lolich.

Tacoma's Faye Throneberry drove in four runs in the 13th hit against Spokane and Dick Gernert contributed a bases-loaded double in the eighth to make things cozy for winner Danny Rivas.

Salt Lake scored four runs in the fifth highlighted by back-to-back triples by George Lund and Tony Washington to take Seattle in the opener.

The second game was no contest as the Bees racked up 20 hits and got a three-run jump in the first inning in a rally spiked by a two-run double by Jack Kubiszyn.

Money Plagued Vancouver Will Complete Slate

Portland - (UPI) - Financially-distressed Vancouver will stay in the Pacific Coast league for the rest of this season at least, president George Norgan assured directors of the league Tuesday.

Norgan told league president Dewey Soriano at a league meeting here that he is hopeful the club can operate next season. He said a promotion expert has been hired to revive interest in the Canadian city.

The directors spent most of the afternoon meeting expressing dissatisfaction at major league policy in regard to 24-hour recalls of players.

No resolutions were adopted, but the league has been assured by minor league commissioner George Trautman that the subject will come up at the next major-minor league meeting.

Ed Machen Gets Draw At Houston

Houston - (UPI) - A rematch between heavyweight contenders Eddie Machen and Cleveland Williams was proposed today as part of September's heavyweight championship fight card in Chicago with the winner of the title bout fighting the Machen-Williams victor later.

Sid Flaherty, manager of second-ranked Machen, suggested the rematch after his boxer drew with Williams in a 10-round bout Tuesday night in San Houston Coliseum.

Williams, the No. 3 contender, felt he had turned in an upset. Most of the crowd of 10,000 partial perhaps to the hometown favorite, and one judge agreed.

Majority Rule
The referee and one judge scored the fight a draw and the second judge gave Williams a three-point edge. Under Texas boxing rules, the bout was scored a draw by majority decision.

Williams, a powerful left-hander, shook Machen in the third and eighth rounds. Machen did not hurt Williams but scored heavily on his effective counterpunching.

"That was one of the best heavyweight fights ever put on anywhere," Flaherty said after the bout. "Both of them looked like real professional heavyweights. I'm happy with the draw."

He said he would suggest to the promoters of the Floyd Patterson-Sonny Liston championship bout that Machen and Williams be rematched on the same card.

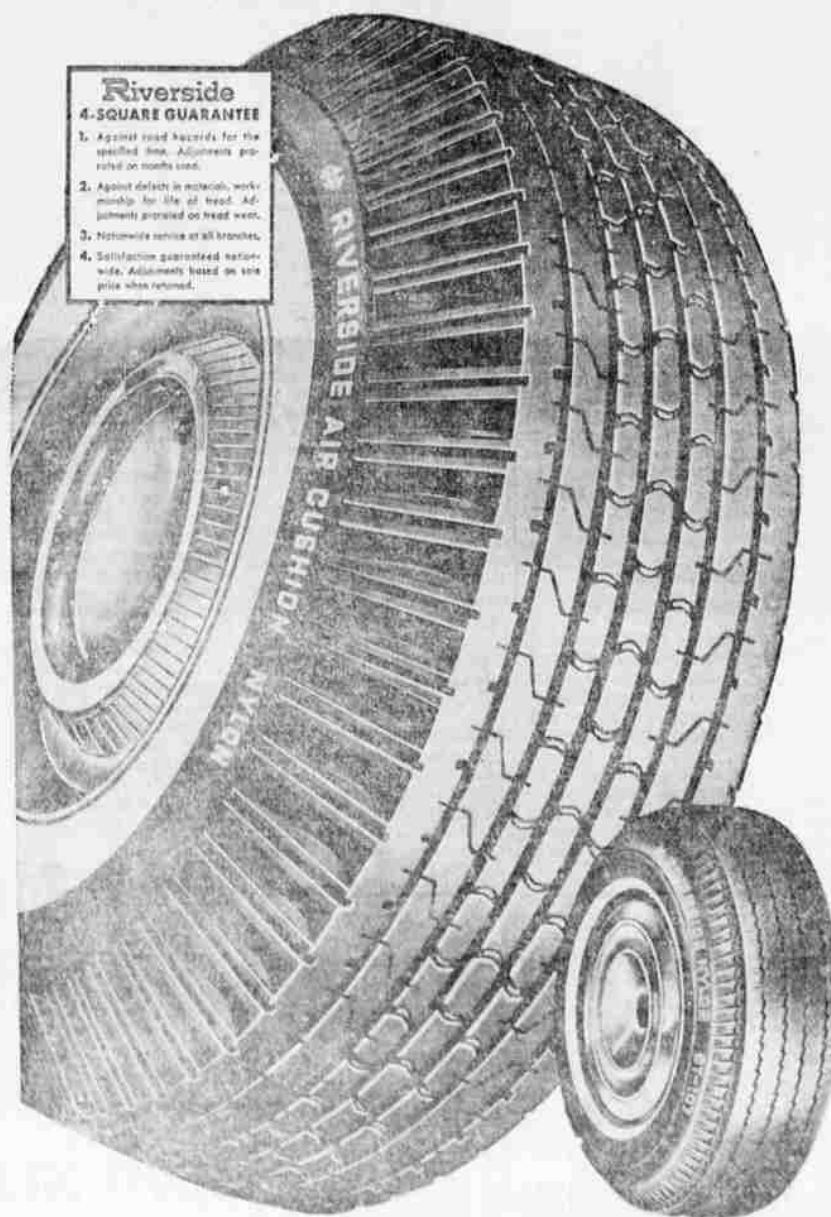
