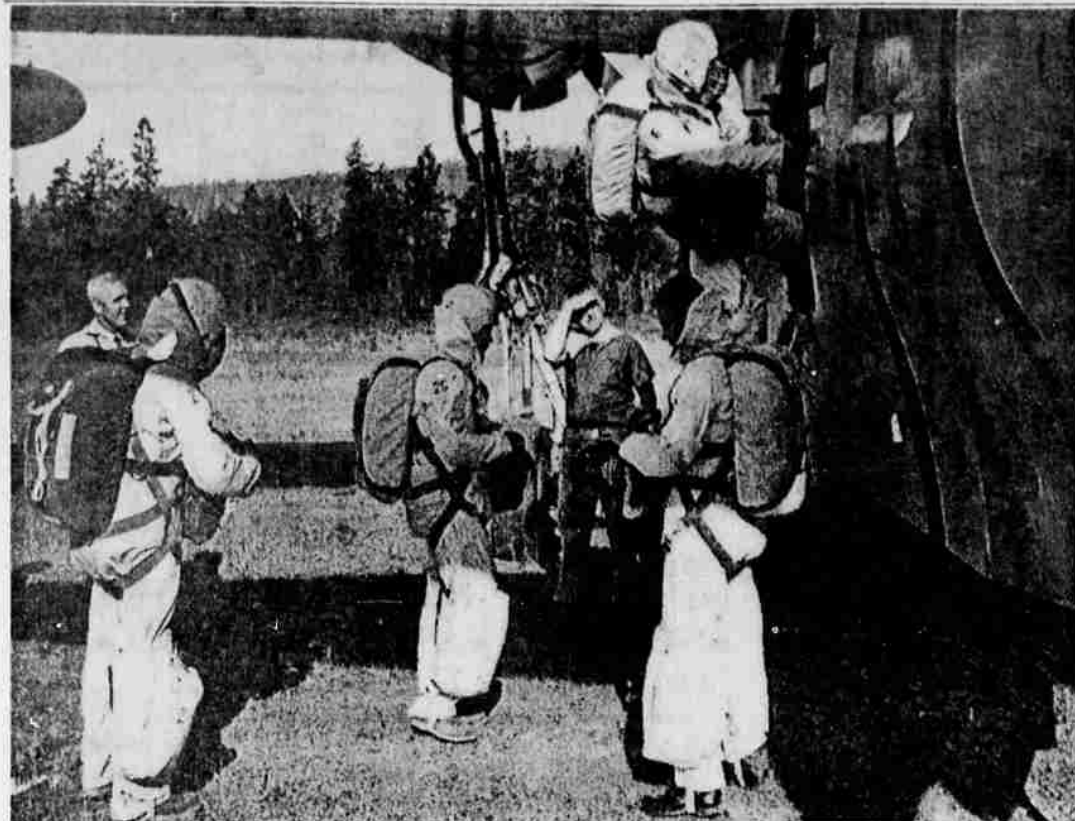

Bunche Lashes Out At Racial Fanatics Within Own Race

On Sunday, June 3, a jetliner crashed during a takeoff at O'Leary Airport in Paris. One hundred and thirty persons aboard were killed - among them 121 of the leading citizens of Atlanta, Ga.

On an auditorium platform in Atlanta last week, Dr. Ralph Bunche, Negro Under Secretary - General of the United Nations, said that every decent American regretted the tragedy.

Then Bunche - addressing the annual convention of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People - lashed out at fanatics and bigots within his own race in language so strong his listeners could scarcely believe they came from the lips of the usually soft-spoken Bunche.

"I both scorn and pity white bigots," Bunche said. "I despise those who are black."

Muslim Speech Cited

What provoked Bunche into his blistering denunciation? It was a speech made in Los Angeles on the same night the charter Air France plane carrying the Atlantans crashed. On that occasion, a tall Negro arose to address a group of 1,500 in a church.

This is how he began: "I would like to announce a very beautiful thing that happened."

"I got a wire from God today which I - well, somebody came and told me that He had really answered our prayers over in France and dropped an airplane out of the sky with over 120 white people on it."

"We call on our God - he gets rid of 120 of them at one whop."

The speaker was a man known as Malcolm X. He is a sort of second-in-command of a fanatic Negro organization known as the Black Muslims. While the members are not recognized by Muslim groups, they profess to follow the Mohammedan religion, praying to Allah as their God, abhorring tobacco and alcohol.

Want Separate State

One goal of the Black Muslims is a separate Negro state within the United States. They make no bones of their hatred of the white race. And they leave no doubt how vindictive they would be toward any whites who might remain in an area they dominated.

The group has only a smattering of followers, those centered mostly in New York, Chicago and Los Angeles. Not more than one Negro in 100 in the United States is affiliated with the Muslims or other extremist groups.

"The so-called black Muslims, who are not at all Muslims and by no means are all black," Bunche said, "practice an inverted racism which is cynical and irresponsible in its exploitation of the Negro's unhappy status."

Roy Wilkins, executive secretary of the NAACP, says he has detected no tendency among Negroes generally to gloat over the misfortunes of whites.

"They Were Human Beings" - This (the Paris crash) was a mass tragedy and I don't even know whether the Atlantans aboard were moderates or segregationists," he said. "I only know they were human beings."

Rev. Martin Luther King of Montgomery, Ala., said:

"I do not feel that the hatred expressed toward whites by Malcolm X is shared by the vast majority of Negroes in the United States."

"While there is a great deal of legitimate discontent and righteous indignation in the Negro community, it has never developed into a large-

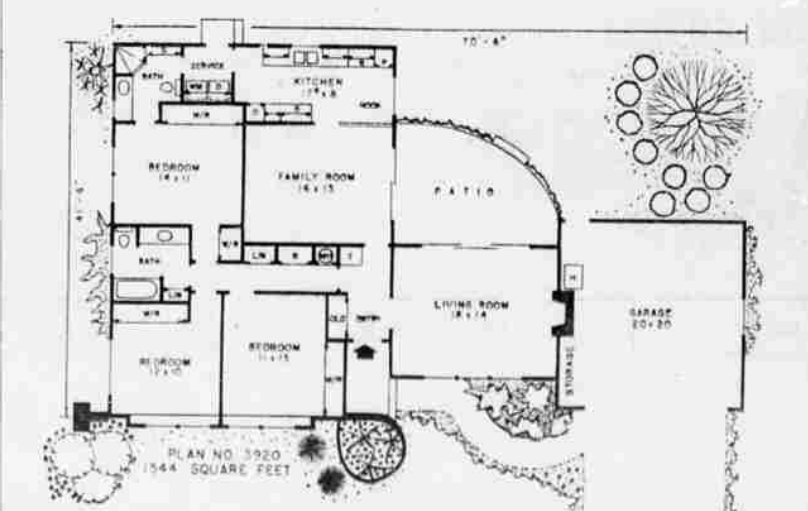
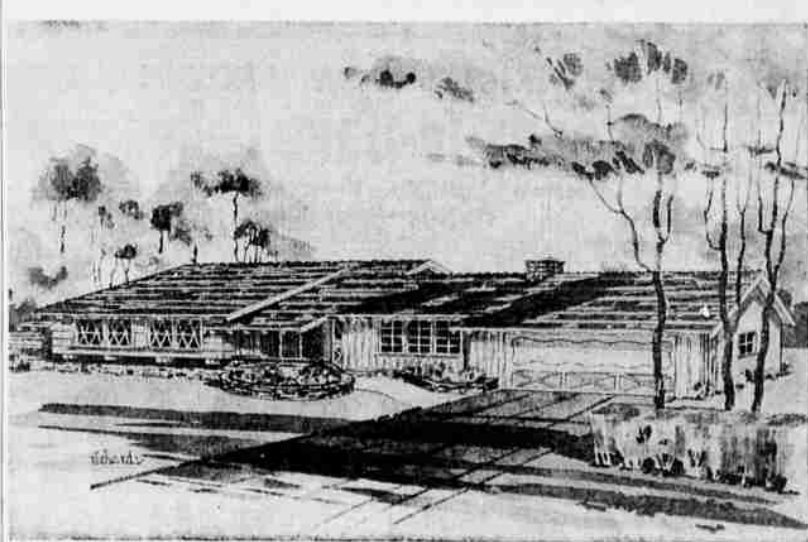
"I am amazed that it hasn't attracted more in the light of the conditions that still exist, and I am speaking of the conditions that they thrive on such as economic deprivation."

This Week's Ranch and Modern Home

The family with a limited budget will find this rustic ranch design attractive, economical to build and well zoned. Careful floor planning has used every foot of space in his home to good advantage.

The traffic pattern in this center hall design is excellent. Very little hall is necessary to reach all rooms from the entry.

Just off the entry is the "dead-end" living room with its massive fireplace located so as to take very little space away from the living room. A bank of windows in the front wall of the room and sliding doors opening to the rear patio offer a two way view plus abundant sunlight and cross ventilation.

Telephone Table
A telephone table has been placed next to the door leading from the entry to the family room. This feature is lacking in most of today's plans.

The three bedrooms are well isolated for privacy from the rest of the house. Each of these rooms offers an unusual amount of storage area for a house of this size.

The small wardrobe which is in addition to the large wardrobe in the master bedroom has been especially designed for the man-of-the-house. It provides a sufficient space for storage of suits and shirts, yet still offers numerous drawers below for other clothing so that a chest-of-drawers is not really necessary.

Three-Quarter Bath
The three-quarter bath at the rear of the house is accessible from both the service-kitchen-back yard and the master bedroom. Such a location serves the same area as two baths in most plans. A wide floor to ceiling storage closet is a feature of this bath. The main bath offers a

pullman lavatory, enclosed tub with shower over and a linen closet.

By proper planning, the kitchen pantry assures that there will always be plenty of food and supplies on hand. Only a partial wall separates most of the kitchen and family room. This plus the large patio provides a large area for more formal entertaining.

The spiral planter in front of the porch, the rounded planter in front of the living room and the continuation of the brick veneer past the bedroom wall adds considerable design interest to the exterior.
