

Funeral Tuesday For Mrs. Billings

Ashland — Funeral service for Mrs. Myrtle Billings, 84, who died July 14 after a long illness, will be held Tuesday at 1:30 p.m. in Litwiler's Mountain View chapel by the Rev. P. Malcolm Hammond, with entombment in Rest Haven mausoleum, Mountain View cemetery.

Myrtle Vine Herbert was born Aug. 26, 1877 to Augustus and Sarah Baldwin Herbert in Oregon, Wis., and at the age of three years she moved to Corvallis with her family. In 1901 she was graduated from Oregon Agricultural college, now Oregon State university. On June 21, 1905 she became the wife of Ralph Billings. Until his death in 1956 the Billings lived on the old family homestead north of Ashland.

Throughout her life Mrs. Billings was active in church, civic and social affairs. She was a member of the First Methodist church for 57 years; a charter member of Fortnightly Study club; a charter member of the Rogue Valley College Women's club, and was a longtime member

of Alpha chapter, Order of Eastern Star, and of the Bellview Grange.

Survivors include one son, John Billings, Ashland; two sisters, Mrs. R. W. Chaney, Ashland, and Mrs. A. B. Bower, Crescent City, Calif.; and four grandchildren. Two sisters and a brother preceded her in death.
