## YCW Members To Be In Portland

Seven Young Christian Workers from Medford will be in Portland next week during the three-day visit to that city of Monsignor Joseph Cardijn, 79-year-old founder of the Young Christian Workers movement.

This is the first time that Father Cardijn has visited the United States since 1959. He organized the group in Belgium 30 years ago. The Christian Family Movement and the Young Christian Students are two American groups within this lay apostolate.

Heading the local delegation will be Robert Betschart, YCW president. The group will leave Medford Wednesday evening and will attend a breakfast Thursday morning at the airport honoring Father Cardijn. That evening Oregon members of the YCW, CFM, and YCS will attend a dinner for Father Cardijn.

Friday evening a public rally will be held in Portland at which Father Cardijn will speak.
