Drysdale Wins 17th As LA Gains Ground

By United Press International Don Drysdale, the major league's top pitcher, won his seventh consecutive game Saturday while leading the Los Angeles Dodgers to a 3-1 victory over the Chicago Cubs with late inning relief help. The victory enabled the Dodgers to increase their National League lead over the second-place San Francisco Giants, who lost to the Pirates, to two games. Drysdale increased his victory total to 17, equalling his two best seasons marks of 1957 and 1959 when he finished with 17-9 and 17-13 respectively. He has lost only four games this season. Drysdale, who had gone the route in his previous six wins, was relieved in this one by Ron Perranoski when Ken Hubbs bounced a double off

Yanks Edge Nats For 9th Straight

By United Press International Roger Maris rocketed the onrushing New York Yankees to their ninth straight victory Saturday by hammering his 24th home run with two on to sink the Washington Senators, 4-3.

Maris' homer was served up by loser Don Rudolph with the score tied at 1-1 in the fifth inning. The blow landed in the third row of the lower right field seats and barely eluded the leaping grasp of right fielder Jim King.

Senators shortstop Ken Hamlin set up the Yankees' three-run rally by fumbling Tom Tresh's hard smash to lead off the fifth and Bobby Richardson then singled Tresh to third, setting the stage for Maris.

Ralph Terry won his 13th game although he departed with two out in the eighth after Harry Bright hit his ninth homer and Chuck Hinton singled. Reliever Bud Daley struck out pinch-hitter Don Lock to seal off that threat.

Terry struck out seven, walked only one and gave up eight of Washington's nine hits during his 7.23 innings on the mound.

In other American league day games, Juan Pizarro pitched the Chicago White Sox to a two-hit, 5-0 victory over the Boston Red Sox, and the Minnesota Twins defeated the Baltimore Orioles.

Monti Takes Early Lead In PGA Golf Saturday

The younger brigade was having more than his share of troubles over the long Aronimink Gold Club course, what with favored Aron Palmer shooting a two-over-par "nightmare round" of 72 which left him five strokes off the pace and U.S. Open champion Jackie Nicklaus carding a 74 for 145 and a seven-shot deficit.

Ford, who won this one seven years ago and before Palmer and Nicklaus were on the national scene, had as his closest competitors a trio consisting of 41-year-old Cary Middlecoff, 37-year-old George Bayer and youngster Gary Player. They were in a three-way tie.

Closest to Monti among the early finishers was big Pat Schwab, a long hitting pro playing out of Wilmington, Del. Schwab, 29, 6-3, also had a 71 with nines of 34 and 37 to give him a three round aggregate of 222.

Dick Bury came in with a 73 for a total of 224. Skee Riegel was at 225, while in the group at 226 were Bill Ezinicki, the former hockey star, Jacky Cupit and Charles Bassler.

Although his lead was going to be a temporary one, Monti kept up the lavender and old lace mob which was dominating the tournament.
