

Palace Possesses History of Kings, Now Head of State

Rome—Pope's kings, an Austrian emperor and pillaging French revolutionary troops have lived in the palace which Italy's President Antonio Segni now calls home.

Built toward the end of the sixteenth century, the Quirinal Palace was used for almost 300 years as the summer residence of the Popes. In 1870, after the end of the church's civil power in Italy, the Quirinal became the residence of Italy's kings until the time of World War II.

The building sits on the highest peak of the Quirinal hill, commanding a view of Rome. The Palace comprises several inter-connecting buildings and a large park surrounded by walls.

The oldest building was begun in 1583 under Pope Gregory XIII and completed in 1610 under Pope Paul V. This building, containing the halls where official ceremonies are held, comprises a broad rectangular courtyard surrounded on three sides by an arcade porch. A double ramp stairway leads on the right to the Hall of the Cuirassier Guards and on the left to the Hall of Ceremonies, the two biggest rooms in the palace.

Frescoes in the Hall of the Cuirassier Guards are noteworthy examples of seventeenth century painting.

Sixtus V was the first Pope to die in the Quirinal. Later almost all Popes lived there until the summer, with some using it year-round.

During the nineteenth century four conclaves were held in the palace, resulting in the elections of: Leo XIII (1878); Pius VIII (1829); Gregory XVI (1831) and Pius IX (1846).

Palace Pillaged

French revolutionary troops occupied and pillaged the Quirinal Palace when they seized Rome in 1798. The French again occupied the palace in 1808 by order of Napoleon I, who arrested Pius VII for refusing to yield.

The Quirinal then was selected as a residence for Napoleon and from 1808 to 1812 extensive remodeling was carried out. But the Emperor never came to Rome.

The apartments were occupied in 1814 by Franz I, Emperor of Austria, who was the guest of Pius VII after the pope returned from prison to the palace.

The people of Rome, demonstrating outside the palace for a constitution, forced Pope Pius IX to flee to the coastal town of Gaeta. During the Roman Republic of 1849, Giuseppe Mazzini lived for a short time in the Quirinal.

Eisenhower Visits Cherbourg, France

Cherbourg, France—Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower returned Monday to this port city he liberated in World War II and said that he planned to visit "old friends" Winston Churchill and Charles de Gaulle.

Gen. and Mrs. Eisenhower arrived aboard the British liner Queen Elizabeth and were honored by speeches at the Cherbourg Chamber of Commerce where the former president signed the city's Golden Book.

"I am always happy to return to Cherbourg which is probably the dearest to my heart as a veteran, for it was here that I began to feel the end was coming for Adolf Hitler," said the former president.

In only one case was the edema due definitely to a plugging up (by a blood clot) of the big vein going through the armpit.

The two doctors treated their patients with a swollen arm by giving them a strong antibiotic for a minimum of seven days, and 94 per cent responded favorably to this. The arm then was measured carefully for a custom-made elasticized dacton "gradient pressure sleeve," extending from the wrists to above the shoulder. The patients were asked to wear this sleeve all day from the time of arising in the morning until that of going to bed. These sleeves have to be replaced when they become loose. A decided reduction of the lymphedema was obtained by 91 out of the 94 patients.

Sometimes the swelling of the arm comes rather suddenly, months or years after the operation, when it appears to be due to an acute inflammation of the tissues of the arm.

Swelling of Arm After Breast Removal

Because hundreds of women write asking me what to do for an arm that has become badly swollen after the removal of a breast for cancer, I am glad to find in a recent number of the Journal of the American Medical Association, an article by Drs. R. C. Britton, and P. A. Nelson, of the Cleveland Clinic, who made a study of 114 patients with what is called lymphedema of the arm after a radical removal of the breast.

It cheers me much to see that in 94 of these patients there was no local recurrence of the cancer. That was not the cause of the swelling — the cause that the physician often hopes against hope is not present.

The study made by the doctors suggests that infection, either entering the tissues of the arm right after the operation or at some later time, is the most important factor in producing the swelling. Occasionally, the surgeon can see whence the infection came — perhaps from an abrasion of the skin, or from an infection of the edges of the surgical wound.

In most cases during the operation the surgeon leaves intact enough tiny channels (lymphatics) for the passage of lymph (a fine fluid which bathes the body cells) and larger channels — veins — which carry venous blood back from the tissues to the heart. The surgeon removes the lymph nodes in the armpit in an effort to get rid of all possible cancerous tissue that may be hiding there. As I said, usually he leaves enough lymphatics to keep the arm from swelling, but sometimes he may either take out too many of these little channels, or some inflammation may come along to close up the ones he left. In a rare case a vein can become plugged up with a blood clot.
