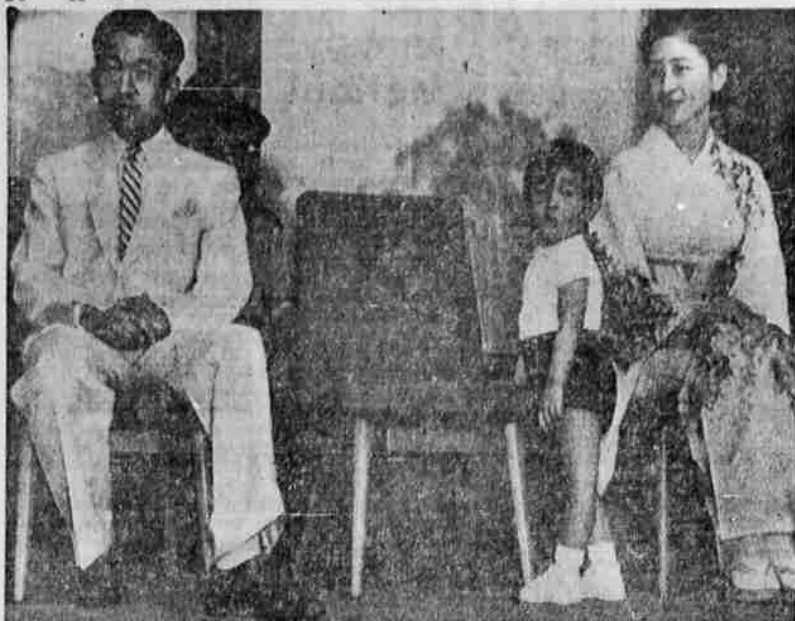

Theater Adds To Economic Activity

Ashland—America's first Elizabethan theater, the Oregon Shakespearean festival in Ashland, has added to Southern Oregon's appeal to tourists, according to William Patton.

Patton, general manager, presented a speech entitled "Shakespeare Is Big Business" during the Southern Oregon college faculty hour last week.

The theater is expected to draw 50,000 enthusiasts this summer with a six week show attendance up steadily from 24,000 five years ago. Seated in a \$400,000 globe-style theater, theatergoers will see a series of four plays that requires about \$128,000 a year to produce, Patton said.

Estimating the tourist attendance to number 34,360, approximately 72 per cent of the 47,723 people at the plays last year, Patton said that these out-of-the-valley visitors spend about \$7 per person above the price of the theater tickets.

This boost to the valley economy averages about \$40,000 a week. Over the six week season nearly a quarter of a million dollars is spent by tourists as a direct consequence of the Oregon Shakespearean festival productions. The \$240,527 spent by theatergoers last year indicates that the Shakespearean Festival is one of Jackson county's major businesses, as well as a focal point for cultural activities in southern Oregon, Patton said.

Is There a Cure for Neuritis? Typical of hundreds of questions I get each month is this one: "Is there a cure for my neuritis?" This question is so vague that I cannot possibly answer it.



There are many types of neuritis, and often all the word means is that the person suffers pain. He may or may not have a neuritis which technically speaking, means an inflammation of a nerve.

He may have an arthritis or fibrositis, or disease in an artery. He may have a pain in his heart, or in a lung or chest wall, or he may have one of those pains which vaguely we doctors call a neuralgia. It may be like a headache. There are pains due to the neuritis that goes

with shingles. Rarely there is a "neuritis" — a strange apparently infectious disease that can suddenly paralyze a person, and then gradually clear up in the following six months.

Rarely would I personally care to diagnose a neuritis without getting help from a trained neurologist who would examine the person carefully. If he did find signs of inflammation and weakness of certain nerves, then I would want his help in determining what agent had injured the nerve or nerves. Was it perhaps a virus, or was it an unrecognized diabetes, or pernicious anemia, or could it be due to some drug such as alcohol?

I remember the 45-year-old wife of a distinguished man who had me fooled for a few days — complaining of a "neuritis" all over, but talking also about her "gallstone"

attacks" for which she said she had to have morphine. Her husband did not help me, except to say that at times she suffered from severe pains. Because these pains were all over her body, I was sure her gallbladder — granting it was diseased — could not be causing all her troubles. Then one day I was lucky enough to see her in a spell and, to my astonishment, she was drunk — in a very lady-like way! If she

had a neuritis, it was due to her large daily consumption of alcohol.

A man once had me puzzled with a very definite neuritis. Because it began with an acute interstitial inflammation, I thought of arsenic, and sure enough, my laboratory man found a large amount of the poison in the fellow's urine. When I told him what we had found, he remembered that just before he took sick his neighbor had

seen his divorced and embittered and half-crazy wife sneaking into his kitchen, while he was away at work. She evidently had put much arsenic into his food.

Because I cannot do all of the necessary detective work for all of the hundreds of people who write me about their supposed neuritis, I just cannot answer their questions. I am sorry; all I can suggest is that they consult a good neurologist.

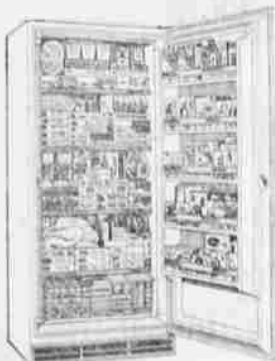

Click-Clack Beetle is Now Geiger Counter Bug

He hasn't changed his shape or his habits in the slightest but modern electronics gives him a more descriptive name, geiger counter bug. Of course a few years ago there were no geiger counters, but the clicking bug was present, clicking away just as does the modern geiger counter when in the vicinity of radioactive material.

This sound, made by the geiger counter bug, has been the inspiration for many names for this common insect. Probably the first common name was click-beetle. Boys named it click-clack because it sounded like the tiny toy used for making noises for Halloween or New Year's celebrations.

Skip-jack, snapping bug, and spring-beetle were other common names. Lending a little more on the scientific side these insects were called the "eyeclickers," and aptly, too, for the eye-spots are very conspicuous.

Placed on Back. Long ago boys purposely placed these beetles on their backs just to hear the sharp metallic click when the bug righted itself. There are hundreds of varieties, usually dark brown or black, sometimes covered with white blotches, giving the bug the appearance of salt and pepper.

The very large eye-spots are velvety black rimmed and white. The real eyes are forward of these eye-spots. In many species both the wireworm larvae and the adult beetles are luminous.

The larvae, known commonly as wireworms, are smooth-bodied and hard, the head is darker colored than the body. In some areas and at some seasons of the year the wireworms are destructive to the roots of plants. It takes several years for complete development; this long interval is spent underground.

The sharp metallic click, a really loud sound for an inch-long insect, is produced by a long process attached to the underside of the body which is held in a socket until released.

Like a spring, the releasing of this "trigger" throws the beetle into the air a short distance, enabling it to turn over and land on its feet, at the same time making the clicking sound. The releasing of this giving jars the beetle to his eyespots and throws him violently into the air, where, like a cat, it twists the body and comes down feet-first.

Glow in Dark. In most tropical species the eye-spots, one on either side of the forward section of the body, glow in the dark with a soft, greenish light. The first amazed individual who noticed this naturally named the beetle, the "automobile bug."

To see the beetle walking across a little open space when the light is just bright enough to separate the moving from the surroundings, it does look very much like a tiny automobile, its headlights glowing.

But times change and sometimes, being conscious of electronic influence, heard the sharp click of the "automobile bug" and renamed it "the geiger counter bug."

THANKS KHRUSHCHEV

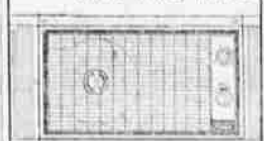

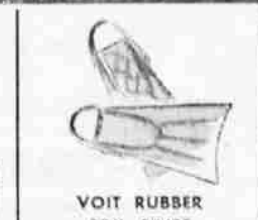

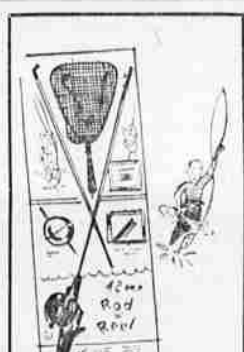
