Eisenhowers Take Copenhagen Tour

Stolen Paintings Recovered Intact

London - (UPI) - Thirty-five paintings stolen two weeks ago in Britain's first million-dollar art theft were recovered intact today in a police raid in London's seamy dock district.

Two detective sergeants of Scotland Yard's elite "Flying Squad" burst into a house before dawn, recovered the masterpieces and arrested two men.

The paintings, worth an estimated \$1.2 million, were the cream of a summer show at the O'Hana Gallery. They were stolen July 11 by midnight thieves who forced a door and fled across rooftops with their loot.

The paintings included works by Picasso, Toulouse-Lautrec, Renoir, Utrillo, Cezanne, Braque, Monet and Manet.

Police said they arrested John Terry and William Bedford, both 30, on charges of receiving the paintings. The actual thieves are still at large, the officers said.

Cholesterol-Poor Diet

Recently, a number of research workers headed by Dr. Seymour Dayton reported a study in which, for some 20 months, they kept two groups (each over 300) of in-living veterans - most of them about 55 years of age - one on a special diet and the other on a regular diet.

The "control" group lived on the usual hospital diet, while the experimental group lived on a well-designated diet low in animal fats and cholesterol. It is admitted that some 20 per cent of the meals were eaten by men from both groups - outside of the institution. The blood cholesterol values of the men on the diet tended to drop some 30 or 40 mg. (milligrams) which may or may not have been beneficial for the person concerned.

In another similar dietary study carried out more strictly on a number of men in a prison, the average drop in blood cholesterol as compared with the figure obtained among the prisoners on an ordinary diet, was some 46 mg. Such a drop could conceivably help a man, granting that his cholesterol value was high to begin with, and that cholesterol is the substance in the blood that has most to do with injuring our arteries.

A New Nose Or Ear

Occasionally a person has to part with an earlobe or much or all of his nose because of a cancer that just had to be removed. In many of these cases a plastic surgeon can fashion a new ear or nose; but in other cases, as when the person is old or in poor health, or when there is a chance that the cancer will return, it is better to have an artist make an earlobe or a nose out of a plastic or a bit of rubber, properly colored to resemble the skin.

I recently talked about this problem with Dr. Arthur Bulbulian, of the Mayo Clinic. He began first making remarkably life-like models of faces and hands and other parts of the body - to be shown in the great Mayo Museum in Rochester, Minn.

Many a time I have stood in that museum behind a group of people who were looking at some plastic hands, and I have listened to someone saying, "They can't fool me; that is a real hand that was removed surgically; look at the wedding ring, and look at the dirt under the nails!" Shortly after Dr. Bulbulian started doing this beautiful and life-like work, the facial surgeons came and begged him to make a new nose or a new earlobe for one of their patients who was much distressed mentally by his great deformity.

Dr. Bulbulian started making these noses and ears, and through the years he has learned to make "prostheses" which are life-like in every way. As we visited, he told me that now this work takes up much of his time. I am sure that hundreds of his patients must keep blessing him and his great skill every day of their lives. No longer do they have to suffer the distress of having people staring at their "opera glass" nose or the side of their head where there is no ear.
