Good Seating Still Available for Most Shakespearean Plays

Ashland - William Patton, general manager of the Oregon Shakespearean Festival, said good seating remains for all of the association's performances this season with the exception of two early in August.

Patton said rumors reported to the Festival by first-night friends may be the reason why attendance has fallen off compared to figures for the same time last year.

"Comments from our patrons in Oregon and northern California suggest that many would-be visitors feel we are already sold out. This is definitely not true. Good seating remains for all of the performances except Aug. 4 and Aug. 8," Patton said.

Patton noted that although on opening night there was a larger crowd than last year, succeeding evenings have been playing to smaller groups, with many choice seats going unclaimed.

By Thursday, July 27, the Festival had played to an even 5,000 persons a figure 1,183 behind the comparable period in 1961. Full houses were expected over the Festival's first full week end, however, and the gap was expected to close a little.

Weather has remained hot and dry, with warm evenings lasting through show-time; there has been no shortage of room and board accommodations in the area; the season's productions were filled with praise, Patton noted.

These factors, plus the increase in tourist traffic, will - Festival officials believe - start the box office curve upward again within a few days. Meantime, patrons who have delayed making their theater plans are advised to complete their reservations.

Now in nightly rotation are "Comedy of Errors," "Henry IV, Part II," "As You Like It," and "Coriolanus." The Festival's special music-dance production, "A Thieves Ballad," opens Aug. 6 and will be seen as an afterpiece to each "Comedy of Errors" performance thereafter.

Tickets may be purchased directly through any of the Festival's branch box offices in Oregon and northern California, or through the central box office in Ashland. Full details on the season's schedule may be obtained by writing "Shakespeare," Ashland.

Activity Continues At White City With New Veneer Plant

White City - A spurt in activity in the White City area has been under way during the past six months. It is a steady, forward move, and not a boom.

The most recent development is a new veneer plant now under construction as an addition to the Olson Lumber company, formerly Ross Lumber company, which is expected to be available in September.

The plant will be thoroughly modern, 400 feet in length and 50 feet wide. White City utility is building a rail spur to the plant.

In February, a new plywood plant started operations. At present about 80 men are employed. This plant, the Rogue Valley Plywood company, turns out sheathing in various sizes. A steady demand for the product was reported by Douglas Gordenier, manager.

Another sign of stability is noted in the building of an office for the Med Ply operation, to be open for business Sept. 1.

Other White City improvements are in progress. A nucleus of 20 or more homes added in the residence section across the Crater Lake highway has been named Cascade Village, and a new row of houses is being erected.

A unique venture opened for business July 14, in the Cascade Sports Marina, carrying a full line of equipment for Rogue valley sports enthusiasts, including guns, fishing tackle, water skis, motors, cycles and boats. This ultra-modern establishment is on Crater Lake highway at the Antelope rd. intersection.

Supplementing these developments are numerous small scale operations, contributing to the diversified lumber interests which characterize the industrial life of the community.

A "House of Wood" across from the Wilson Lumber company setup, expanded with an additional shop at the VA Domiciliary entrance, where a large volume of specialized woodwork is handled.

A small paint factory has been turning out Golden West paints for the past two years. It is run by R. I. Taylor who moved in from Medford. He manufactures his own product including a complete line of paints, enamels and varnishes.

Jack Spears conducts a hauling and repair business with 15 trucks, operating under the name of the Eagle Wood company. The main business is the hauling of wood and sawdust for the heating of homes.

Fashion also appears in the tiny dress shop for the women, who reside in the neighborhood and many who shop there from nearby towns as well as tourists.

Contract Awarded For Water System

A contract for \$44,514 was awarded to H. W. Houston Construction company, Portland, the lowest of eight bidders, for construction of a water system at Munson valley, Crater Lake National park. Superintendent W. Yeager has announced.

The work includes installation of a 150,000 gallon steel reservoir, 2,455 feet of six-inch and four-inch water mains and other appurtenances to enlarge the water storage and distribution system at Park Headquarters for domestic and fire protection purposes. Ninety calendar days are allowed for completion of the work.

The project is another in the Mission 66 Program at Crater Lake National park to enable the National Park Service to better serve the increasing number of visitors to Oregon's only National Park.
