Supply Diverted

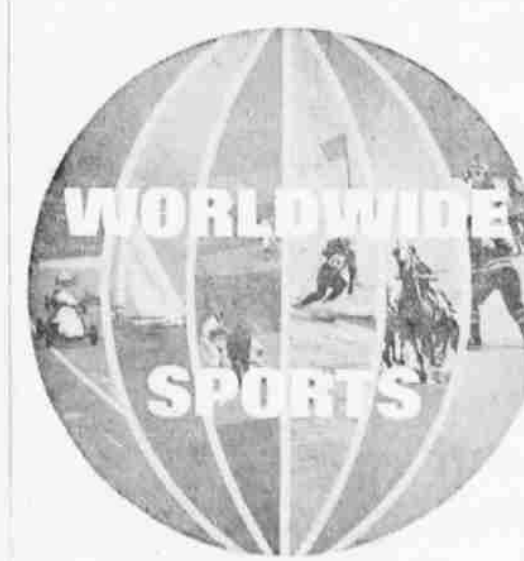
Salt Lake City — A "disturbing" jump in the level of radioactive iodine 131 has prompted a diversion of the Salt Lake City milk supply from pasture-fed cattle to those fed on dry grain and hay.

The sudden rise occurred following recent above ground nuclear testing in Nevada. The state health director said the Salt Lake City milk shed got the highest contamination of any city because of wind currents.

The Medical Roundup

There are millions of people who have a backache that is bearable, and there are thousands who have a backache that is almost unbearable, or which makes work or even getting out of bed almost impossible. In these cases it is a tremendous help to have a team of experts making a study, and using their great experience in the field.

I was just reading an excellent article by Dr. N. W. Hoover, P. J. Kelly and William J. Martin, of the Mayo Clinic, who described their experience with types of backache in which the pain is very severe, and lasting. They spoke of an inflammation of part of the spine due to a definite germ. In most cases the germ seems to get into the spine by way of the bloodstream.

The infection may come from the skin, or the upper respiratory tract, or from the urinary tract. Sometimes a man with a urinary infection who has a cystoscope (lighted tube) passed into his bladder will later develop a severe inflammation of the lower part of his spine, with tremendous backache.

Usually the spinal muscles are tense. The patient, if he is able to walk at all, will walk gingerly, because each time he takes a step he gets more pain and more spasm in his back muscles. The pain often is referred into the abdomen because it follows long nerves that come out of the spine and run forward. In many of these cases, the diagnosis can be made by pushing a specially designed needle into a spinal vertebra or into the tissues alongside of it, and thereby getting out some material which then is examined for germs.

Ex-Officials Admit
Improper Actions

Washington — Two former government officials have conceded they had improper arrangements with a mining firm that profited more than \$4 million in selling nearly useless chrome ore to the national stockpile.

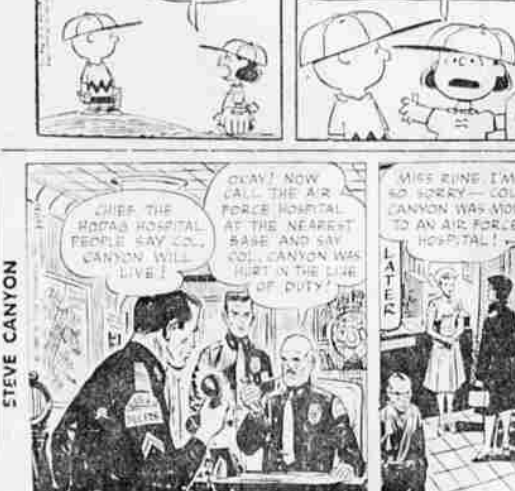

George B. Holderer, Arlington, Va., said he had advised company officials about GSA policies while he headed a division which negotiated the chrome contract.
