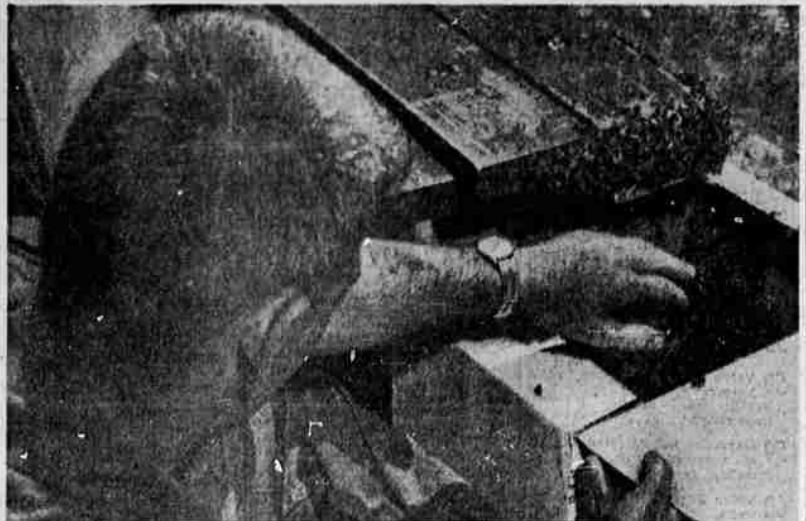

Crews Return at Vancouver Plant

Vancouver, Wash. - (UPI) - Some 800 union workers were back to work at the Aluminum Company of America plant here today following settlement of the nationwide Alcoa strike.

The strike was settled Wednesday afternoon between the company and the Aluminum Workers International Union. Settlement of a dispute involving the Reynolds Metals Co. followed.

Pickets at the plant were removed after the settlement was announced by federal mediators at San Francisco. The workers walked out Tuesday night and picket lines were put up before midnight. The plant was in the process of closing down.

Work was not halted at the Alcoa plant at Wenatchee, Wash., and at the Reynolds plant at Tijuana, Wash. Workers at the Reynolds plant at Troutdale are members of the United Steelworkers of America. Workers at Wenatchee were in the process of shutting down when the strike ended.

PACK WITH PLASTIC
New York - (UPI) - Plastic bags help make packing and unpacking easier. Travel experts advise that lingerie, jewelry and cosmetics can be put in the plastics, arranged to form a relatively flat surface and placed on the bottom of a suitcase. RESERVISTS RELEASED
Washington - (UPI) - The Navy has released the last of the reservists it called up last fall to meet the Berlin crisis. A total of 8,343 officers and men were returned to civilian life Wednesday. They were inactivated along with 40 ships and a number of planes.

Senate Approves Plant at Hanford

Washington - (UPI) - The Senate Wednesday voted approval for a complex arrangement that would permit construction of the world's largest nuclear power plant at the Hanford, Wash., Atomic Works.

Acting by voice vote, the chamber authorized construction of an 800,000 kilowatt generating facility which would use excess steam from the government's Hanford nuclear reactors.

The Senate proposal by Sen. Henry Jackson (D-Wash.) was tacked on to a bill authorizing funds for the Atomic Energy Commission.

The measure went to a

House-Senate conference committee to iron out differences. The House recently rejected a plan to permit construction of power facilities at Hanford.

Lake Ronkonkoma, N.Y. - A beach club in this Long Island community found the perfect solution to the problem of teaching children how to perform correctly a fundamental swim stroke. Swim instructor Raymond Roe employed the services of "Lady," an aqua-canine to demonstrate the dog-paddle.

Ghana President Escapes Bomb

Accra, Ghana - (UPI) - A bomb hurled at President Kwame Nkrumah's automobile killed two persons and injured 60 others Wednesday night in the upper region of Ghana but Nkrumah escaped injury, the government announced today.

The incident occurred at Kingulungu, 30 miles north of Bawku, near the border of Upper Volta.

Nkrumah had just finished talks with Upper Volta President Maurice Yameogo.

Nkrumah was reported to have been taken to a nearby

hospital and released after a checkup.

The killed were identified as a policeman and a schoolboy. Among the 60 injured was E. Assumda, the regional commissioner.

Unofficial reports said about 25 persons were rounded up for questioning following the blast.

The bomb went off at 4:30 p.m. Wednesday as Nkrumah was alighting from his car to inspect a parade at the Ghana border after crossing from neighboring Upper Volta, a former French colony which now is independent.

Washington - President Kennedy, disclosing that the U.S. may agree to simpler policing methods in a nuclear test ban treaty:

"It may be that we shall not need as many (on-the-scene inspections) as we have needed in the past, but we can find no justification for the Soviet claim that a test ban treaty can be effective without on-site inspection."

Los Angeles - Postman Felipe Gonzales, explaining why he carried 4,500 pieces of mail around in his car for months while residents on his route complained they received no mail:

"I guess I'm just lazy."

Kansas City, Mo. - A Federal Aviation Agency spokesman, commenting on the near-collision Tuesday of two jetliners with 184 persons aboard:

"The error obviously was at the control center. It was a human error, not mechanical. We intend to find out exactly why it was committed."

Washington - The will of the late Arizona Sen. Henry Fountain Ashurst, who left an estate of \$390,000 and had no children:

"Owing to the fact that I was for a time politically conspicuous, a number of children have been named for me. In the event any person claiming or pretending to be my child or grandchild should by any court of competent jurisdiction be decreed to be my child or grandchild I hereby give and bequeath the sum of \$10."
