Portland - Furniture workers Local 3182 struck two firms here today after wage talks bogged down. Pickets were posted at Portland Furniture Manufacturing Co. and Fashioncraft Furniture Corp. The strike involved 29 furniture workers. Some 174 upholsters and teamsters honored the picket lines. The union is seeking a 12 1/2 cent wage increase.

Hay Fever Map Made To Aid Vacationers

Bloomfield, N.J.-To help weed out the troublesome allergen-tree, weed or grass pollen, a pharmaceutical firm here has prepared a hay fever map of the United States. Morse Praises Delay Agreement

Washington - Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) Wednesday praised an agreement to postpone the communications satellite bill for ten days as "very wise." At the same time, he renewed his recommendation that the measure be laid aside until after fall elections to give the public a chance to express its views. The bill would create a private corporation to run a communications satellite system under close government supervision. Morse and a small band of other Democrats have filibustered against it as a "giveaway." The Senate agreed to send it to the Foreign Relations Committee briefly for hearings on its foreign relations aspects. Morse, a member of the committee, said he assumed the hearings would be open to the public.

Indonesia Buys United Nations Bonds

United Nations - Indonesia has purchased \$200,000 worth of the \$200 million United Nations emergency bond issue bringing to \$78,308,257, the total amount purchased or pledged to date. The announcement Wednesday brought to \$27,740,000 actual payments made so far by 14 countries of the 46 pledged to make bond purchases.
