## Blackberries Said Ripe in Prospect District of Forest

Blackberries are reported ripe in the Prospect district of the Rogue River National forest, according to the weekly recreation report from the forest.

The berries are generally plentiful in many of the old clearcut areas, forest officials said.

Huckleberries will not be ripe for about three weeks yet, forest service officials said.

The recreational report by district:

Applegate district: All roads are now open to vehicular traffic. The Glade Creek rd. has not been graded, but will be next week. It is rough and

should only be traveled by a pickup.

Forest service crews have graded the loop road, and it is now in fine shape. Trails have all been maintained this spring, and they are all open.

All campgrounds are receiving heavy use, and the recreation guard is keeping up with the cleanup.

The Dutchman Peaks area was full of wild flowers last week, and people are asked to leave them for the next person.

Butte Falls district: Fly fishing has been good on the South Fork of the Rogue river above the Lodgepole guard station. Late evening hours should be the best. The Lower South Fork and the Upper South Fork campgrounds are recommended for those wishing to spend the week end on the river. Directions may be obtained at the Butte Falls ranger station or at the Lodgepole guard station.

The trail up the Middle Fork of the Rogue river has been opened and is in good condition. Excellent fishing in secluded surroundings can be enjoyed by those walking two or three miles up the trail. Directions should be obtained at the Innaha guard station, as a new road has cut off a mile of the old trail.

Hot weather the past week has brought the mosquitoes out in full force and insect repellent will make a visit to the forest much more enjoyable.

Prospect district: All trails and campgrounds on the District are now open. Cautious driving will be required on Woodruff and Jim Creek roads due to heavy traffic.

Temperatures have been above normal for the area the last several days. Daily temperatures from 85 to 98 degrees have been common with comfortable evenings. The forests are dry and people are asked to be extremely careful with fire.

Huckleberries won't be ripe for about three weeks, but ripe blackberries are plentiful in many old clearcuts.

Fishing is still good in the area. Good catches of 8 to 10-inch rainbows have been reported in the upper branches of the Rogue river; best results obtained with grasshoppers or flies in the morning or evenings.

Union Creek district: All campgrounds and roads are open on the Union Creek district. Clear skies and warm weather make camping and fishing conditions ideal.

The district is presently working on opening up the Logpile trail.
