Fort Jones Methodist Is Fixed by Palo Alto Youth

Yreka — A group of Methodist Youth Fellowship members from the First Methodist church, Palo Alto, were in Fort Jones last month to help the Fort Jones church make repairs on the building.

For recreation they swam, hiked and went sight-seeing. On July 4 they picnicked on Scott river. Entertainment was also provided by Etna and Yreka members. Miss Janet Elsen of Yreka visited them for one day as a representative of the Yreka MYF and some of the Fort Jones young people helped the group with the project.

The trip was worked out by the Palo Alto group by the district superintendent of the Methodist church.
