Davis, Wills 'Steal' Victory For Dodgers

Fleet-footed Willie Davis hit a two-run homer and stole a pair of bases Saturday as he and teammate Maury Wills raced the Los Angeles Dodgers to a 5-3 victory over the Chicago Cubs.

The four bases Davis and Wills stole between them increased the Dodgers' total for the season to 119, the most any National League club has stolen since Cincinnati ran up 134 in 1929.

For Wills his two stolen bases increased his league-leading total to 56 and the first theft in the opening inning was responsible for a run. After stealing second, he went to third on a wild throw from the catcher and scored on a single. And Wills was on base in the fifth when Davis hit his 15th homer of the season into the stands.

Stan Williams was credited with his eighth lifetime win over Chicago against one loss although he left the game in

the seventh and Ron Perrano finished out the last three innings.

Harvey Kuenn singled for his third hit of the game to drive in the decisive run in the seventh inning as the San Francisco Giants downed the Pittsburgh Pirates, 6-5. Jack Sanford went seven innings, yielding 10 hits, including a homer by Bob Skinner, to win his 14th game.

Ray Washburn pitched 6 1/3 innings of no-hit ball and wound up with a four-hitter in the St. Louis Cardinals' 2-0 victory over the Houston Colts. A double by Gene Oliver and a single by Dal Maxvill drove in the Cardinals' runs in the fourth inning.

The Milwaukee Braves swept a doubleheader from the Philadelphia Phillies, 8-2 and 7-3. Joe Adcock's three-run first-inning homer paced the Braves in the first game and a grand slam homer by Tommie Aaron in the bottom of the ninth won the nightcap.

The New York Mets swept a doubleheader from the Cincinnati Reds, 9-1 and 3-2 in 14 innings. Roger Craig pitched a nine-hitter and Charley Neal, Marv Throneberry and Clarence Coleman homered in the first game and Frank Thomas broke up the four-hour and 20-minute nightcap with his 26th homer of the year and his seventh in five games.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH
Cincinnati, Ohio — Slugger Frank Howard of the Los Angeles Dodgers has been named winner of the National League "Player of the Month" balloting for July. Howard batted .381 during July, in 26 games he had 37 hits, including 12 homers, and drove in 41 runs. He had 36 votes in the balloting by baseball writers and broadcasters while teammate Don Drysdale, who had a 6-0 pitching record during the month, was second with 11.

Drysdale Wins 20th Of Season

Don Drysdale of the Los Angeles Dodgers is the first major league pitcher to win 20 games and at the rate he's going he could become the first 30-game winner since Dizzy Dean.

The side-wheeling 26-year-old fireballer won his 10th straight game Friday night when he pitched an eight-hitter to beat the Chicago Cubs, 8-3, and move the Dodgers five games in front of the National League race.

From the standpoint of the Dodgers' pennant prospects, the win was especially significant in that it was Drysdale's fourth straight complete-game triumph since his southpaw staff-mate Sandy Koufax was sidelined by a hand ailment.

Needs Even Break
With 53 games left on the Dodgers' schedule, it is estimated that Drysdale will make 12 or 13 more starts. And with an even break in luck, big Don could become the first pitcher to win 30 games since old Diz turned the trick in 1934. Drysdale has lost only four games so far this season.

To most baseball men, Drysdale is about four years late in "arriving." During spring training in 1958, a poll of writers picked Drysdale as the pitcher who should win the most games during that season. But that was the year the Dodgers moved into the makeshift Coliseum. And of all the pitchers on the staff, the ballpark disturbed Drysdale the most. He won 12, 17, 15 and 13 games during the four seasons at the Coliseum and then proved his point with his remarkable improvement this year.

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
