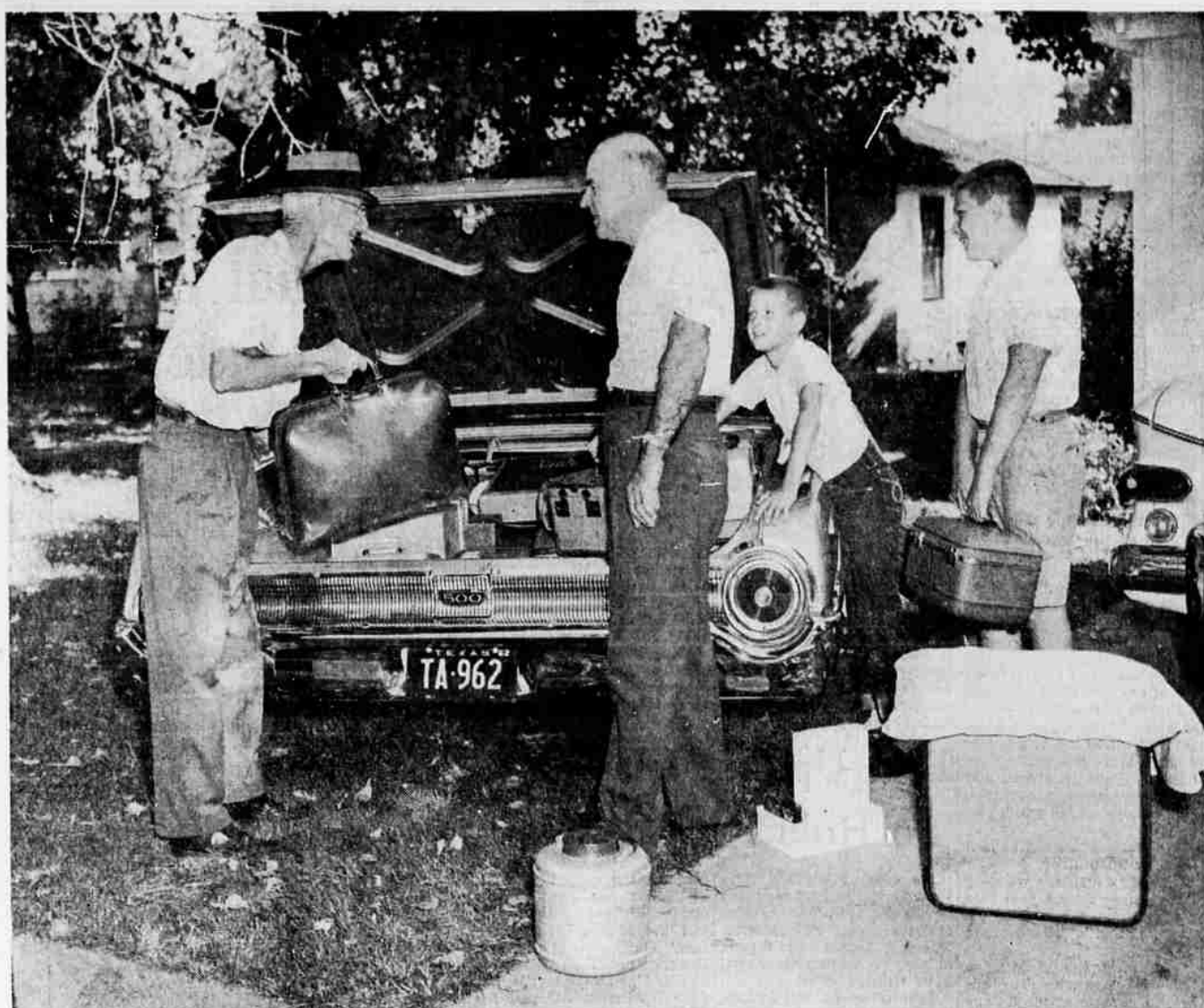


Visitors—Travelers
