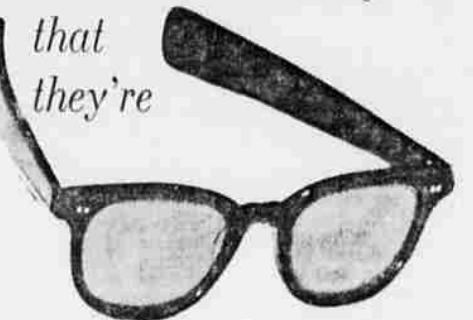
Following the ceremony a reception was held at the Bosworth home on South Oakdale avenue.
