With her hosts, Mrs. Crotsau plans to travel to Seattle this week where the group will attend the World's Fair, and from there she will return to her home.

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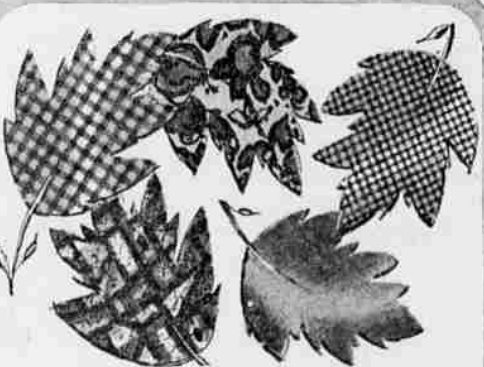
