Millard, pastor of the New Age church, Eagle Point, will officiate. Interment will be in the Trail cemetery. Mr. Sneed was born April 22, 1889, at Coquille, Ore. On March 30, 1918, at Madras, Ore., he was inducted into the U.S. Army. He served as a Private with the 44th company, 116th Depot Brigade until Jan. 18, 1919. He lived for several years in Bandon, Ore., and has made his home for the past 24 years near Trail. For the past two years he has been employed as a watchman for the Fred Schaffran Logging camp. On May 24, 1941, in Trail, he was married to Mary Caroline Fry, who survives. Other survivors include two step-sons, Charles Fry, Trail, Earl Fry, Warrenton, Ore., three grandchildren and one great grandchild. Pall bearers will be Dennis Mason, Thayne Mason, Kirt Mason and Thomas McElrath.
