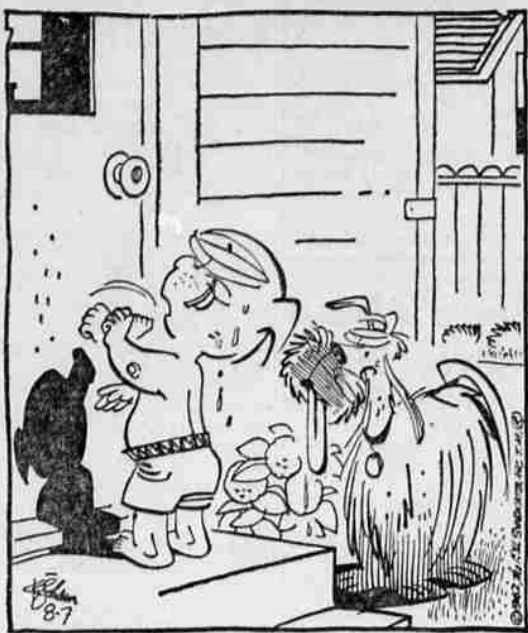

Wondering About Winter?

Check Squirrel's Tail

Very soon now we will begin to harvest the annual crop of prognostications as to the severity or the mildness of next winter.

It is doubtful if we have any brand new theories, but all the old ones will be rehashed. Many of these prophecies will be based on how wide the stripe is around the woolly bear caterpillar, or how much more material the muskrat will pile on top of his cattail igloo, how high the honking goose will hang, or how bushy or how scraggly will be the tail of the squirrel.

There are many schools of thought regarding each one. It's going to be difficult again to know which "class" to attend.

Squirrel's Tail Sure Sign

There are many folks, some supposedly well versed in the textbook of the woods, who claim the condition of the squirrel's tail is the one sure sign. A heavy, bushy tail, they say, indicates a long, cold winter. If the tail is skimpy and whipped out, the coming winter will be mild. A squirrel with a thick, bushy tail would slay pretty comfortably on a cold night.

For associated with many of these long-range forecasts, if not all of them, are the peculiar explanations that attempt to clarify the reasons.

Some of these seem so logical it's little wonder they are so firmly believed in. They help to justify the reason why so many are part of the folklore of America.

That person who might pooh-pooh the "woolly bear" story may be a firm believer in the bushy tail theory. If a poorly-haired tail is all the animal needs, he can control the amount of hair and at least correct the situation. Even if the tail was bushy during the summer, the animal will start pulling hair out long before the first cold snap. He certainly wouldn't enjoy too warm a fur-piece wrapped around his neck.

More Active

Some woodsmen, hunters and trappers who are among this group claim warm fall weather causes the animal to be more active than usual, and in its tearing around it whips out most of the hair. This, they say, means warm weather ahead.

These folks will claim the early-flying geese, the nut-burying squirrel and the concerned muskrat are all pikers.
