

### Commission To Receive Riding Stable Proposal

A proposal for having riding stables at Howard Prairie Recreation area will be presented to the Jackson county parks and recreation commission Aug. 15.

Nell Ledward, parks and recreation director, said this week that the possibility of developing the stables "looks good." Recently, Ledward, along with commission member Mrs. Marcel LePine, met with Clyde Wilhelm at Howard Prairie. Wilhelm, now operates the riding concession at Lake of the Woods.

The recreation director said that "Lilly Glenn" was being considered as a name for the proposed stables. The "Lilly Glenn Riding Stables," if developed, would be located about two miles from the main HP recreation area.

"Lilly Glenn" is the name of an historic settlement including a post office and school — dating back to the late 1800s, Ledward said. An old ranch and barn still stand at the site. The director noted that the stables would be of historic significance and expressed his concern about preserving them.

Property for the stables would be leased by the commission from the bureau of reclamation, he added.

Ledward, Mrs. LePine and Wilhelm last week toured the reservoir, studying places to provide bridle paths. It was pointed out that in many cases old county roads could be used for the paths. Eventually, Ledward predicted, it is hoped that trails might extend entirely around the lake.

Connect Areas  
Wilhelm, who presumably would operate the riding concession at Howard Prairie if okayed by the commission and the county court, reportedly would like to connect Howard Prairie and Lake of the Woods with riding trails. A trail from Lake of the Woods now crosses the side of Brown Mountain and comes within four miles of Howard Prairie, it was noted.

Ledward said that riding clubs would especially be enthusiastic about the proposal for having the stables. Clubs and individuals could take their horses and camp in the area.

Not too much is expected to be done on the plan this summer, if approval is granted, Ledward said, however, that the area would probably be developed through next spring for riding enthusiasts to enjoy it.

### Science Meeting To Take Place At OSU

Cornwallis-Oregon State university will play host Aug. 26 to 31 to the largest scientific meeting in Pacific Northwest history.

More than 4,000 biological scientists are expected to participate in the joint meetings of the American Institute of Biological Sciences and the Pacific Division of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

AIDS — a group of 27 scientific societies and 23 affiliated societies, with some 65,000 members in all. Thirty-seven scientific groups will be meeting concurrently during the week.

More than 2,100 research papers will be presented during the meetings. Keynote speaker will be Dr. Melvin Calvin, California chemist and Nobel prize winner. He will report on possibilities of life on other planets.

### Dog Control Board Submits July Report

A total of 160 cats and 93 dogs were destroyed by the Jackson county dog control board during July, according to its monthly report.

The report was submitted to the county court this week by Chris Hader, dog control officer.

Hader said 88 cats were brought to the pound, while another 109 were picked up. A total of 356 cases involving dogs were handled during the month. Some 72 dogs were picked up, 47 were brought in, 100 bitches were found for 12 and 21 owners claimed their dogs. Some 55 lost dogs were reported, he added.

### Court Approves Liquor License Request

A package liquor license has been approved for the Casey Park store, route 3, box 1285, Trail, by the Jackson county court.

Commissioner Edwin H. Taylor personally checked the application and presented a favorable recommendation for the license Wednesday.

Seeking the license was Pearl B. Bosom, operator of the store. The request is now referred to the Oregon Liquor Control commission.

**Small Worlds Around Us**

**Tap, Tap, Tap!** is Stoneyly Tapping to His Girl

The sound was distinctly like the tapping of a tiny hammer on an anvil!

Previously we had noticed alongside the stream that ran through the woodland an abundance of discarded nymph shells left by the larvae of the stonefly when they emerge from the water to become flying insects. This would explain the tapping noise, for underneath the abdomen of the male stonefly is a small, hard plate called a percussive disk.

The insect selects some hard object and taps out some sort of a message for the female. We have to go along with the "stone" part of the name, for it is usually on a stone where the larval skin is shed, and it is under a stone on the creek bottom that the larva lives. The larva does spend about three years as an aquatic creature, and most of that time is spent under a stone. Then, when it emerges, it anchors to a stone and leaves its moulted skin when it becomes a flying insect.

It's somewhat of an exaggeration to call the stonefly a flying insect. Flight evidently doesn't come to it easily, as it takes in the air with seeming reluctance. Even when forced to fly, it travels but a short distance, then attempts to hide beneath a rock or other pondside litter. On a cloudy day it can hardly be made to fly at all, but is slightly more active on a sunny day.

No Beauty Rival

The adult stonefly is far from rivaling the beauty of a moth or a butterfly; it even looks ridiculous as a fly. The body is long and out-of-shape, soft and equipped with two pairs of legs that are not wings somewhat like those of a fly. The head is wide and blunt, almost square. It has a biting mouth.

The larva stage, spent at the bottom of a brook or river, lasts two or three years. Most of this time is spent hiding under stones. It ventures out to prey on other aquatic insect larvae.
