

## City Tennis Tournament Opens Saturday With Junior Singles

### Fernandez Fights Phil At Eugene

Eugene — (UPI) — Cuban Florentino Fernandez, a man who fought for a share of the middleweight championship a year ago, tries to get back some lost prestige tonight.

The left-hooking Fernandez will meet Phil Moyer of Eugene in a 10-round middleweight bout at the Bethel baseball park here. A crowd of more than 8,000 is expected.

The muscular Cuban, who now lives at Miami Beach, Fla., has suffered two technical knockouts in his two starts this year since dropping a split decision to Gene Fullmer in an attempt to gain part of the title in his last fight last year.

Fernandez was beaten by Dick Tiger on a sixth-round TKO in January and lost to Joey Giambra on an eighth-round TKO in April. The losses have dropped him to seventh among the contenders in his class in the National Boxing Association rankings.

But he is a favorite against Moyer on the basis of a fifth round TKO win over the Oregon battler in 1960.

Moyer, the older brother of high-ranking middleweight contender Denny, has won four of his five fights since coming out of a year's retirement last April. He defeated Sugar Ray Robinson in his last scrap last month.

Fernandez has a 30-5 record and Moyer has a 27-6-1 mark.

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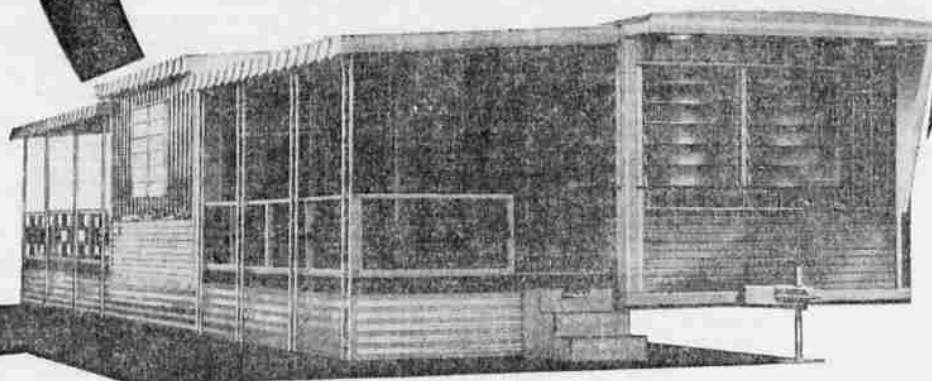
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
