**First State Park Land Leased for Oil Exploration**

Salem—The first lease of state park land for oil exploration was approved by the State Highway Commission Thursday but protections were provided to see the scenic beauty is not disturbed.

The 81-acre North Santiam State park was involved in the lease to Superior Oil company which was also given a lease for 90 miles of highway right of way in the area.

However, the lease provides that the surface of the park area will not be broken, no additional access roads will be constructed through it or no drilling rigs will be placed on the park property.

The oil firm will employ slant drilling to explore beneath the state lands. The lease calls for drilling to be done adjacent to the park and exploration must start within three years of the date of the lease.

The state will get 30 cents an acre for 10 years and will receive one-eighth royalty if the drilling is successful.

The commission also approved the sale of five forest waysides on the Carpenterville-Brookings section of the Old Oregon Coast highway in Curry county to Brookings Plywood Co. for \$388,000.

In the future the commission decided that fishing would be prohibited from the Westford-Coyote creek bridge, Warren slough bridge, Middle Ford-Coyote creek bridge and Coyote creek bridge on the Mapleton - Eugene highway and on Fat Elk creek bridge on the Coquille-Bandon highway.

All of the bridges are old, have no walkways and have a considerable amount of log truck travel and commission members decided that fishing would be dangerous.

**Peanut Butter Bread Is Quickly Made**

Here is a quickly made peanut butter bread that gives variety to packed lunches, to tea party sandwiches, late-at-night party sandwiches as well as offering real mealtime eating pleasure. Good just with butter or when spread with cream cheese and/or marmalade.

- 1 1/2 cup shortening
- 1/4 cup peanut butter
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups sifted flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup milk

Cream shortening and peanut butter together. Add sugar and continue creaming until light. Add well-beaten eggs. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together and add alternately with the milk. Mix until well blended. Bake in greased loaf pan in moderate oven, 350 degrees, one hour.

**Dessert: Beauty**

Arrange fruits such as peach slices, cantaloupe balls or tiny wedges, berries, pineapple sticks or chunks, orange slices or segments and grape clusters. In center bowl, place dairy sour cream or unsweetened sauce from any fresh, canned or frozen berries. Toasted coconut or sesame seeds are further optional enhancements.

**Tomato-Onion Salad**

For Six Super Savings

For this delectable combination of tomatoes and onion slices, some perfectionists dip the whole tomatoes - one at a time - in rapidly boiling salted water to cover and let stand about 15 seconds; then peel the tomatoes, remove and discard the cores. We simply slice the elegant thin-skinned beefsteak tomatoes and proceed like this.

- 2 or 3 large beefsteak tomatoes
- 1 medium size onion
- 3/4 cup salad oil
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon peel
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 2 tablespoons anchovies, finely chopped
- 6 tablespoons dairy sour cream

Parsley for garnish. Slice tomatoes; chill. Peel onion and cut into thin, almost transparent slices. Combine the olive oil, lemon peel, lemon juice, salt, pepper, oregano and anchovy. Garnish each serving of tomato slices with the onion rings and pour the anchovy sauce over them. Put one tablespoon of dairy sour cream on top of each serving and garnish with parsley. Six servings.

One of the easiest ways to fry fish is on foil in a very hot oven with very little fat; just enough to "oil the foil."

**Carrot Cookery**

Golden carrots, canned or

cooked, get new look and flavor excitement like this. Arrange carrots in shallow baking dish. Mix gingersnap cookie crumbs with some melted butter; sprinkle over carrots. Bake at 350 degrees 15 to 20 minutes to heat throughly.
