

Center Activities Outlined

Miss Mary Ellen Bell, former Jackson County public health nurse, will show colored slides at a recent European trip at a meeting Monday, August 13, of the Arm Chair Travel group of the Senior Activity center, 601 East Jackson street. The showing will begin at 1 p.m.

Miss Bell has made several trips to European countries in the interest of young people there and her pictures include glimpses into family life and foreign customs not usually seen by many tourists.

For this showing Miss Bell has selected a special trip down the Dalmatian coast by boat, through the Adriatic sea to the southern part of Yugoslavia, where she stayed in Dubrovnik, said to be the most beautiful city on the Adriatic sea.

From there she traveled by bus through the countryside of Yugoslavia up to Sarajevo, then by train to Belgrade to bordertowns of Hungary. The pictures will point up buildings erected during the 400 years of Turkish occupation, an influence which dominates present development rather than western influence.

Register Craftsmen

On Monday, August 13 from 10 a.m. to 12 noon, members of the receiving committee of the Senior Craftsmen of Oregon will be at the center to register new craftsmen who wish to sell their hand-craft at the branch shop in the Ashland Art gallery, 31 Water street, Ashland, during the months of August and September. All craftsmen who have not yet picked up their articles which were not accepted at the last jury meeting are asked to call or come in Monday morning.

Members of the committee report that 11 local artisans have been accepted as senior craftsmen and their work now is on sale to the public at the shop. Continuation of the local branch is now being considered through the Christmas holidays.

Advice Given

Many of the 21 applicants to date are working to produce more saleable articles with the advice of the jury and design committee. Most of those entering the venture are well trained craftsmen but some have made articles not readily saleable to the tourist or local market.

Committee members point out that because this project is to aid senior citizens, applicants should not become discouraged by initial rejections by the jury, and point out that ample opportunity will be given craftsmen to re-enter crafts at any time.

The receiving committee meets on Monday mornings though appointments can be made by telephone at that time for a more convenient time, if necessary.

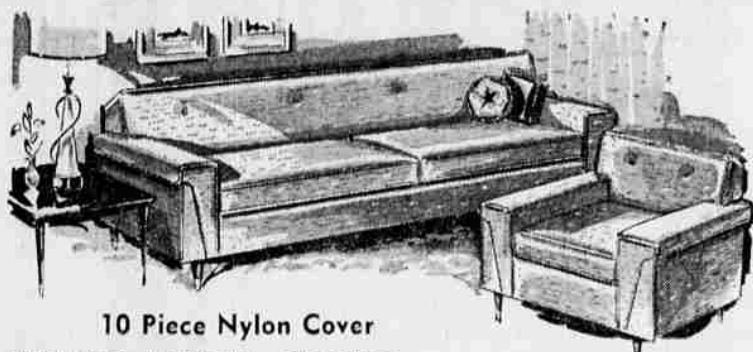
The minister and his family expect to return for another visit in the Rogue Valley next year. He is especially impressed with the lumber industry.

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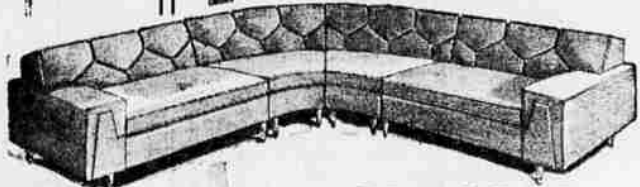
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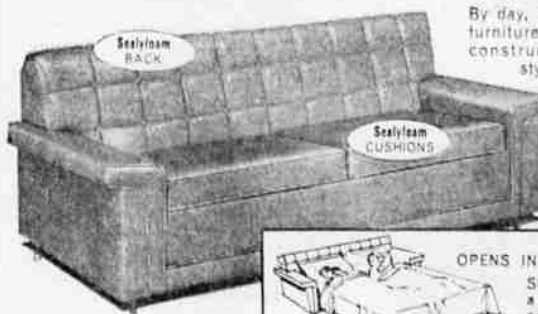
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
