OSU Selected To Join In Program

Corvallis-Oregon State university is one of five U.S. land-grant colleges selected as participants in a new agricultural scholarship program sponsored by the General Foods Fund, Inc.

Under the program, OSU will receive a total of \$9,000 during the 1963-64 and 1964-65 for scholarships mostly to freshmen—in food science and technology, pomology and vegetable crops, and agricultural engineering.

The program will start with ten \$400 freshmen scholarships in 1963-64. Five of the 10 recipients will receive \$200 study grants the following year also and 10 more \$400 freshman scholarships will be awarded.
