

Jackson County 4-H, FFA Fair Program Listed

Home economics and non-livestock exhibits, with the exception of flowers, vegetables, and wool, were in place today in preparation for judging at the annual Jackson county 4-H and Future Farmers of America fair.

Fairgrounds cleanup was held, and the judging of the fair will start tomorrow at the fairgrounds south of Medford.

Horsemanship contests were held last week end, with saddle horse judging, showmanship, trail horses, and colt classes judged Saturday, Aug. 4. Other divisions and run-offs of the same contests were held Sunday.

Saturday and Sunday judging of non-livestock and home economics exhibits will be held. During these days the fair is closed to the public and will open Monday at noon. The schedule for the fair throughout next week follows:
