107 Log Truck Operators Given Haul Permission

Salem—UPB - One hundred seven log truck operators have been granted permission to haul as a result of hearings held since April...

The PUC granted 2,376 permits under the "grandfather clause" to truckers who were in operations within the specified dates.

So far 13 truckers have been denied permission to operate after hearings and 10 cases were dismissed.

A total of 235 truckers have sought permission to operate under the hearings procedure.

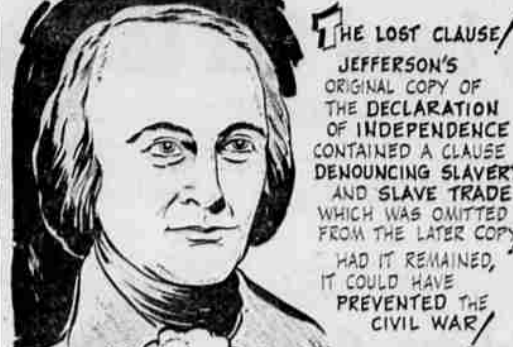
Protests have been filed against every applicant for hauling rights who has gone through the hearing procedure...

Miami, Fla. - UPB - New York attorney James B. Donovan is expected to leave early this week to confer with Fidel Castro on the release of the prisoners of the Bay of Pigs invasion.

Donovan, who was instrumental in getting U2 pilot Francis Gary Powers released from Russia, is reported to have secretly conferred with Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy and had the project approved by the Justice Department.

Exiles in Miami's Cuban colony were hopeful Donovan's trip will reopen negotiations to free the prisoners.
