Westbrook Pegler,

Syndicate Break

New York (UPI)—Westbrook Pegler, 68, and the Hearst-owned King Features Syndicate, which circulated his column for 18 years, announced Monday they were severing relations.

"Too many irreconcilable differences on vital matters had existed between the parties to continue a workable relationship," said the announcement, issued at Hearst headquarters here.

The contract had been signed to run until 1964. Compensation for the remaining time, the announcement said, "was settled by mutual agreement."

The columnist's opinions were at one time circulated to 186 newspapers, reaching a maximum readership of 12 million persons. Of late about 140 papers had printed the column.

The announcement did not elaborate on the differences between the Hearst organization and its controversial columnist.

22 CUBANS CHARGED

Nassau (UPI)—Bahamas police today planned to formally charge 22 Cubans with illegal fishing aboard four boats towed in from waters around the island group 150 miles south of here.

George McKenzie, government fisheries officer, said he and three policemen armed with rifles caught the Cubans fishing illegally during the week end. He said all four boats were owned by a Cuban fishing cooperative and that the fishermen would appear in magistrate's court on the charges.

Father's Decision Saves Boy's Life, Kills Own Children

Redmond, Wash. (UPI)—Donald Paul Sanford wept softly. "There was nothing else I could do. I saved another man's son and killed two of my own children."

"At the moment there was nothing else I could do. Looking back... if I had to do it again, I'd have to do just what I did."

Sanford, 34, a physical education instructor at Seattle's Garfield High school, with his wife, Virginia Ann, 31, beside him and three children in the back seat, was on a shopping trip.

Slowed for Cyclists
He slowed at nearby Bellevue as he approached Jeff Pickford, 12, and Steve Jeffers, 13, a pair of Bellevue boys cycling on the shoulder of the road.

Sanford's tragic moment of decision came seconds later. "Without warning, both turned off the shoulder and into the roadway directly in front of me," he said. "One boy saw my car and darted back. The other boy did not. There was nothing else to do—out of human compassion. It was either hit—and kill—that boy, or swerve."

"I cranked the wheel hard over. The total two-lane roadway is only 22 feet wide. Before I could straighten the wheel, the car was on the opposite gravel shoulder."

Sanford's car plunged over a six-foot embankment and dived into a pine tree. The three children were thrown from the car.

Stephen, 7, landed on his feet and was unhurt.

The other two Sanford children, Donald, 9, and Mary, 2, were thrown to the ground.

The car toppled and shattered their bodies beneath it. A tow truck had to be called to lift the vehicle from the bodies.

Sanford and his wife were not seriously hurt but were treated for shock.

Young Schuster, whose life was spared by Sanford's decision, could add but two words. "I'm sorry."

Oregon Fir Trees Have Biggest Hips

Three judges gave Oregon a dubious victory Monday—the fir tree with the biggest hips.

But they said Washington's biggest fir tree is faster farther up and taller as well.

The judges were trying to settle a long-standing contest between the two states over which can boast the biggest Douglas fir.

They said Oregon's Catsop fir measured 15.48 feet in diameter four and one-half feet above the base, the official measuring level. Washington's big tree at Queets measured 14.46 feet.

The Washington tree, however, was more than two and one-half feet bigger around than the Oregon tree at its top. And it was 202 feet tall, compared to 200 feet, six inches for the Oregon tree.

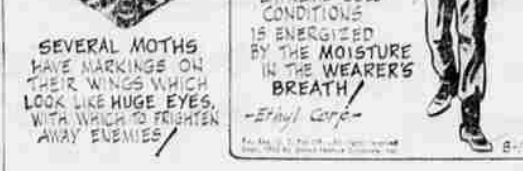
