Underdeveloped Countries To Get Television Sets

Washington—UPI—The United States has agreed to provide 250 million portable television sets, which it hopes will help bring education to underdeveloped countries.

The countries don't have enough electricity to run the sets, an official of the Agency for International Development said. He suggested they could be powered by little children playing on merry-go-rounds.

A House government operations subcommittee took a dim view of this method of uplifting less fortunate lands.

Many illiterates

The project's originator, Dr. Gerald F. Winfield, chief of the agency's Communications Resources Division, told congressmen there were 250 million children not in schools and 500 million illiterate adults in 80 countries now receiving U. S. foreign aid.

He said the objective of the educational television plan was to teach people agriculture methods, homemaking and other subjects to raise their standard of living.

Rep. Porter Hardy (D-Va.), chairman of the subcommittee, called the plan "one of the biggest pieces of foolishness I've seen in some time."

Rep. George Meader (Mich.), top Republican of the group, had another criticism.

"Did it ever occur to you," he asked Winfield, "that one of the best things we can do for these people is to shield them from television?"

Winfield replied that the agency was only interested in educational broadcasts.

The agency signed a \$400,000 contract in June with the Warwick Manufacturing Co., Chicago, for 1,000 of the transistorized television sets. These will be operated in underdeveloped communities of five or six yet unchosen countries where there is no power supply.

Winfield said part of the plan includes experiments with small gasoline generators, windmills, merry-go-rounds and other devices to recharge battery-powered sets.

Helispots Planned In Wild Areas

Washington—UPI—The U. S. Forest Service will construct 18 helicopter landing spots in the Goat Rocks and Mt. Adams wild areas of the Gifford Pinchot National Forest, Rep. Julia Butler Hansen (D-Wash.) reported Wednesday.

Mrs. Hansen said she had been told by Regional Forester J. Herbert Stone that the helispots, intended to improve fire protection this summer and fall, would "cause very little conflict with wilderness use."

ORDERS INTEGRATION

Richmond, Va.—UPI—Federal Judge John D. Butzner Jr. Wednesday ordered the nearby town of West Point, Va., to admit 10 Negro children to white or predominantly white schools in September. Butzner also ordered the school board to produce a plan to further desegregate its elementary school. Two Negro children attended West Point's white high school last year, but the elementary school remained segregated.
