

Counterfeit Money Brings 15-Year Term

Portland — Ernest Schultz, 43, Portland, was sentenced here Wednesday to 15 years in Federal prison for possession of counterfeit money.

Schultz, who owns a printing business, was arrested by Portland police last March. Federal Judge Gus J. Solomon said he would reconsider the sentence after a 90-day psychological study.

New Motel, Coffee Shop Opens

The new Hyatt Chalet motel, 56 North Riverside ave., opened for business last week. The 50-unit motel is located on the former Merrick motel property, for many years a Medford landmark. Operators of the new business are Mr. and Mrs. Lee Rehana, co-owners, who have come here from Yuba City, Calif.

The interior of the lobby and business office is of teak wood paneling and stained glass windows are used in the design. Frank J. Daily of the Albert Parvin and company, Los Angeles, did the motel's interior decorating, and all the furniture and other furnishings are custom made, done also under Daily's direction. The business is open 24 hours a day.

Denny's coffee shop is to open the end of the week and will be operated by Cecil Halstead, formerly of Santa Ana, Calif. Here in charge of the opening is L. A. Moran, Long Beach, Calif. The coffee shop, also to be open around the clock, will seat 88 persons, with counter and booths. Ahnert and Davis company, Los Angeles, were in charge of

the building. The business is a part of a chain of 77 coffee shops throughout the country. Approximately 20 persons will be employed and moderately priced food will be featured. The interior decor is in muted yellow and flame colors.

A filling station in rancho type architecture by Humble Oil and Refining company, is to be built next to the motel lobby over the site of the old Merrick's Ballroom and Plunge.

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Goldberg Opposes Short Work Week

Chicago — Labor Secretary Arthur Goldberg has told his former AFL-CIO colleagues the Kennedy administration can solve the nation's unemployment problem without cutting the work week.

Goldberg met privately Wednesday with the 27-member AFL-CIO Executive Council, which is holding its summer meeting through Friday. The one-time AFL-CIO general counsel told the labor leaders the administration shares the 16 million member organization's full employment goal, "but we have opposed a reduction of a work week."

Earlier this week the Executive Council adopted AFL-CIO President George Meany's recommendation that labor unions begin a drive for a 35-hour work week as a means of creating more jobs.

Multnomah DA's Funeral Friday

Portland — Funeral services will be held Friday at 10:30 a.m. (PST) for Charles E. Raymond, 67, Multnomah County District Attorney who died Tuesday night. Services are to be held from J. P. Finley and Son Mortuary.

Gov. Mark Hatfield is expected to name a successor to fill out the remainder of Raymond's term soon.

Raymond's death left the county without an official state's prosecutor. Acting Presiding Circuit Judge Virgil Langtry said the September jury calendar was a heavy one, including eight murder trials among nearly 100 criminal cases.

Thornton Rules on Easement Charges

Salem — The State Land Board has no authority to charge a person or corporation for an easement to build a transmission line over state-owned land in a city. Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton said today.

Under Oregon law, free access across state lands is allowed for construction, operation and maintenance of overhead electric lines except in incorporated cities. The opinion said that the exceptions in cities was in regard to the home rule principle which allows cities to regulate utilities within their boundaries and was not intended to allow the state to charge for an easement.

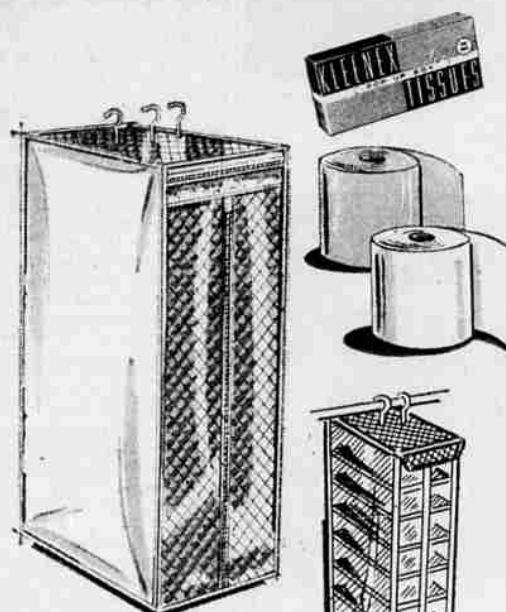
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
