Two-Car Accident Checked by Police

A two-car accident south of Medford Wednesday night resulted in a minor injuries and extensive property damage, according to Oregon State police.

Vehicles operated by Marvin Dale Ayers, 37, of 1854 Kings highway, and Florence Cornell Foster, 76, of 3761 Cornell of Ester, 74, of 3761 South Pacific highway, Medford, collided about 9:35 p.m. Wednesday on Highway 89 about three miles south of Medford.

Police officers said the Ayers car was northbound and the Foster vehicle was southbound. The driver of the southbound car apparently was attempting to make a left turn off the highway, police said, and turned in front of the Ayers car.

Mrs. Foster sustained a cut over her right eye, and both cars were damaged extensively, according to officers.

Education Report Given On Honors System In Bend

Eugene - The Bend High school has done a very unique job in introducing new programs and carrying through some experiments which show considerable promise, according to an evaluation report.

The report is by the Oregon school study council of the University of Oregon's school of education. General chairman of the evaluation and editor of the report was Dr. Keith Goldhammer, professor of education at the University and executive secretary of the study council.

In 1959 the Bend High school began a program to improve the quality of instruction. This program included encouragement of student self-direction, flexible scheduling of classes, extended laboratory scheduling, and an honors program.

Student self-direction includes provision of blocks of time for students to be free of supervision to study, go to the library, or to downtown areas. This "honor system" is under student control.

The evaluation report found this system resulted in high

morale and civic pride, a high degree of student responsibility, and increased emphasis on academic learning and self-improvement, as well relieving the teachers of a large share of custodial functions.

But the report found there was need for better understanding of the system by adults in Bend, that there was excessive noise in the study hall, and that there might be

a lack of carry-over of the honors system to other classes.

The report found the small classes allow for challenging class discussion opportunities. Evening "fireside seminars" gave opportunities to provide a channel for student self-improvement, according to the report.

The report concludes that the Bend programs have raised the level of aspirations of Bend youth and given them a seriousness in their studies. But the report added that additional financial resources are needed for the programs, including additional buildings and teachers.

Portland To Get Can Making Plant

Portland - Plans were announced today for Libby McNeill & Libby to build a new can manufacturing plant in the Union Pacific Rockwood Industrial district east of Portland.

The Heller Construction Co., Sacramento, will start work next Monday on the 3½ acre site purchased by Libby from Union Pacific.

The plant will supply canneries in Portland and in Walla Walla, Yakima and Kent, Wash.
