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Guardsman Injured At Camp Rilea

Camp Rilea, Ore.—(UPI)—Pfc. Donald Scroggins, 19, of Toledo, suffered a cut tendon and burns to his left hand Thursday morning when a piece of ammunition exploded in the breach of the 40 mm gun he was firing.

Scroggins was taken to an Astoria hospital. His condition was described as not serious.

Five other men near the gun suffered cuts and bruises and were treated on the scene.

The accident took place at 11 a.m. on the firing range of the National Guard camp here.
