Swollen Arm After Removal of Breast

Many women write to ask why, after they had a breast removed for cancer, the arm on that side swelled distressingly. Dr. R. C. Britton and P. A. Nelson of the Cleveland Clinic made a study of 114 patients with what is called lymphedema of an arm.

Because spreading cancer cells often follow the lymphatic channels, when a surgeon removes a cancerous breast he usually takes out most of the lymphatics in the nearby armpit. If perhaps he leaves too few of the little vessels, or if something happens later to destroy the few that he leaves, the woman can get a big arm.

I was much cheered to read that in 94 out of the 114 women studied, the trouble with the arm was not due to recurrent cancer, and I was glad to hear that in many cases it obviously was not due to some x-ray treatment that had been given (because the swelling came first).

In most cases, the doctors decided it was due to inflammation. Accordingly, they gave antibiotics, and usually this treatment helped. Also, they had the woman wear a light "gradient pressure sleeve" extending from the wrist up to the shoulder.

Dr. J. Arthur Myers recently spoke before the annual meeting of the National Education Association. There he pointed out that still, with all the tremendous advances in the treatment of tuberculosis, there are too many children who are dying of this disease, and they are dying because the town in which they live is not concerned enough with the easily solvable problem of saving them.
