### Senate Leaders Hope To Pass Farm Bill By Nightfall

Washington — Senate leaders pinned their hopes today on passing the farm bill by nightfall. They are counting on a debate-limiting agreement as the key to their planning. Assistant Democratic Leader Hubert H. Humphrey, Minn., said he was sure a voluntary time limit on debate could be worked out.

The pending bill contains only part of what President Kennedy asked. A more far-reaching proposal was approved by the Senate but defeated in the House.

The stiffest fight now shaped up over a Republican effort to let wheat growers choose between the present program of voluntary controls with high price supports and the tougher administration "certificate" plan.

Sen. Karl Mundt (S.D.) leader of the GOP move, claimed considerable support. Humphrey, however, predicted the Mundt amendment would be rejected.

Other congressional news: Poll Tax — Rep. John V. Lindsay (N.Y.) charged today that House leaders had worked out a plan for approval of a relatively mild measure on the poll tax that would fend off broader civil rights action this year, Lindsay said.

Propaganda — A spokesman for the American Jewish Congress told the Senate Post Office committee today that a bill to bar Communist government propaganda from the mails would boomerang twice, Alan R. Wurtzel, Washington counsel for the group, said that the measure would allow the attorney general to decide what type of political opinions the American people should be allowed to receive in the mail.

Gun Kills Former Military Flyer — The Dalles — A former military flyer who had three planes shot out from under him in World War II died of a gunshot wound here Sunday night.

Wasco county sheriff's deputies said Robert Curtis Fulton, 46, was killed when a shotgun went off while he was cleaning it. Coroner Kenneth Libby said the death appeared to be accidental.

Fulton was a holder of the Air Medal with 16 clusters, the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Purple Heart and the French Croix de Guerre.

Medford Woman Gets Gold Honor Emblem — Mrs. Blanche Powell, 545 South Ivy st., Medford, has qualified for a solid gold honor emblem from Reader's Digest for the eighth consecutive year.

According to magazine officials, the award is made in recognition of prominent service as a community representative of the publication. The publishers award the emblems to those who have actively represented the magazine in their communities for 25 years or more.

Veteran Oregon Newspaperman Dies Portland — (UPI) — William A. (Bill) Warren, 58, veteran Oregon newspaperman, died Monday evening of an apparent heart attack. Warren, who retired from United Press International two years ago because of illness, worked for the news service in Oregon for more than 16 years including several years as bureau manager in Salem. Earlier, he was with the Oregonian in Portland and the Associated Press in Portland and San Francisco. He was born Nov. 6, 1903 in Seattle. Survivors include his mother, Mrs. Will Warren, Portland; three daughters, Mrs. Thomas Hickman, Portland; Mrs. Richard Kluser, Pico Rivera, Calif.; and Susan Warren, Portland; a son, Rev. Lindsay Warren, Salem; four brothers, three sisters and 16 grandchildren. St. Johns Funeral home is in charge of arrangements.
