

Bellinger To Try Again Tonight for Elector Signatures

Albany — (UPI) — A sleepless vigil is being held this week in Albany waiting for electors.

The vigil, which started Saturday afternoon, might end at 8 o'clock tonight with the nomination of Donald F. Bellinger as an independent conservative candidate for governor.

Or it might not. Bellinger, who describes himself as an opponent of federal spending, is not sure whether he will have the required number of 250 electors tonight. But he's hoping.

The marathon "assembly of electors" started Saturday and sponsors were not able at that time to muster up the magic 250 names to put Bellinger's name on the November Oregon ballot.

Confusion Possible
At that time, it was announced that some confusion about the date of the assembly might have been caused by an erroneous news broadcast by Willamette Valley radio stations.

The assembly was held over until Sunday afternoon after an all-night stay in the hall to keep proceedings legal, but again there weren't enough names submitted.

Then, it was announced that the final caucus in what Bellinger describes as possibly the longest nominating convention in the state's history, would be at 8 o'clock tonight.

Someone has manned the post at the Albany American Legion hall, convention headquarters, ever since Saturday to keep the proceedings in continuous session as required by law.

"Oregon elections clerk Jack Thompson said we can recess and continue to register," Bellinger said, "and call a caucus tonight. It is necessary for those who previously registered to appear and an oral poll of delegates will be made."

Advocate Amendment
Bellinger advocates the so-called "Liberty Amendment"

to the Constitution which calls for withdrawal of all non-profit government corporations, which, he says, are costing American taxpayers \$19 billion per year. He is a Salem contractor.

He announced today: Due to an erroneous release, by persons unauthorized, the Saturday meeting was disrupted. A further unauthorized release which stated the meeting would be on Sunday prior to the assembly officials actually making a decision caused further confusion.

Bellinger said he "again challenges Gov. Mark Hatfield and Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton to come before the people of Oregon to explain the legal relationship of the state of Oregon in the council of state governments."

Eisenhower Pays Visit To Belfast

Belfast, Northern Ireland — (UPI) — Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower, the only foreigner ever made a Freeman of Belfast, returned Tuesday for the first time since World War II.

Eisenhower, who was supreme allied commander in Europe when he was honored here, flew from Scotland in a U.S. Air Force plane with his wife and two grandchildren.

Northern Ireland Gov. Lord Wakehurst and Premier Lord Brookeborough met them at Belfast airport.

The Eisenhowers met the mayor and city council at the city hall and had a private lunch with Lord Wakehurst before flying on to Dublin.

Eisenhower spent five days in Scotland on a golfing vacation during his sentimental European journey. He stayed at the apartment in Culzean Castle given to him by the Scottish people.

The Eisenhowers leave Cobh, Ireland, for home Friday aboard the liner America.

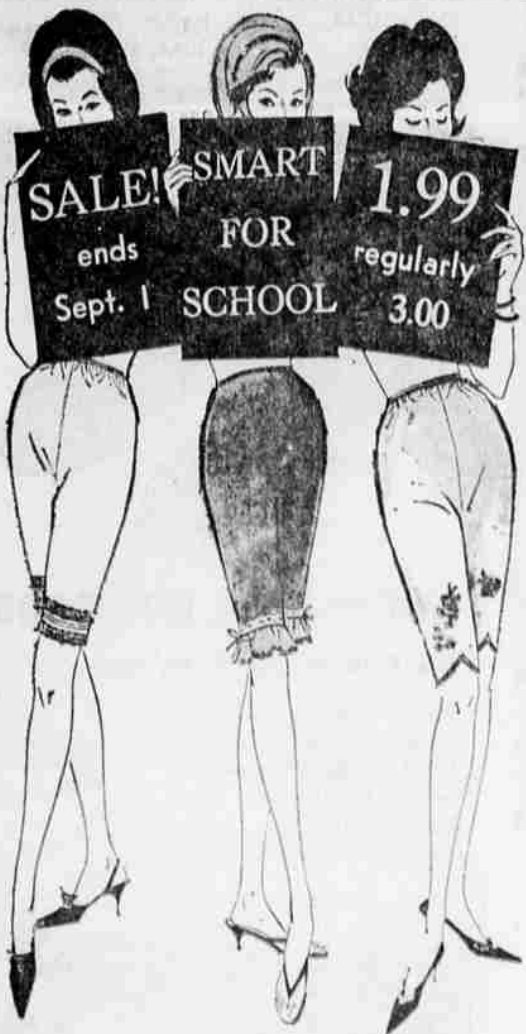
