Grapes Have Great Appetite Appeal

There's super abundance of grapes. There are hundreds of delicious ways of enjoying fresh grapes and here are some of them.

Grapes in Orange Juice. Place green seedless or dark grapes with seed removed, in fruit juice glasses. Finish filling with fresh orange juice. Chill and serve as first course for luncheon or dinner.

Grape-Fruit Cup. Arrange halved grapes, fresh pineapple wedges and fresh orange sections in layers in sherbet glasses using one cup of each fruit. Combine three-quarters cup orange juice, two tablespoons lemon juice and one-quarter cup sugar; mix well and pour over fruit. Chill. Garnish with a cluster of grapes. Makes six servings.

Grape-Cheese Canapés. Combine one-half cup finely crumbled blue cheese, one-half cup cream cottage cheese and one-quarter cup dairy sour cream. Season to taste with ground thyme. Spread on squares of bread and top with halved grapes (seedless or seeds removed).

Grape Stuffing. A superlative stuffing for a five-pound chicken or for a duck. Combine five cups toasted bread cubes with two cups grapes (seedless or seeds removed), one teaspoon salt, one-quarter teaspoon ground black pepper and one-third cup melted butter or margarine. Toss lightly. More Berries

Rejoice in berries. The season's harvest of red raspberries is far ahead of last year as Oregon and Washington keep them rolling. Black raspberries, mainly from Oregon

are beyond compare. Serve them with cream, whipped cream, ice cream.

Thumping Good Watermelon Time

Watermelon experts tell us that "thumpings" may determine whether a watermelon is ripe rather than immature but that it is not test of the degree of ripeness. The plug or cutting a wedge into a melon may determine its degree of ripeness but the melon isn't going to last long thereafter if the plucker decides not to take it. After thumping just for the fun of it, check these characteristics for quality: melon should be firm and symmetrical, fresh and attractive in appearance, have a "bloom" over the surface of the rind giving it a velvety appearance. The ground side of the melon is usually yellowish in color, compared to white or pale green in an immature melon. Personally, we continue to look the melon over for bee stings. Figure that if it is sweet enough for us, it's good enough for you. A medium size watermelon averages 15 to 20 pounds. Average serving in the rind is two pounds. One pound of watermelon as purchased, supplies 58 calories.

Melon Care
Ripe melons keep best at an even 45 degrees. If stored too long or at too low a temperature, breakdown occurs very rapidly when they are removed to room temperature. Handle watermelons carefully; refrigerate as soon as you get them home.

It takes at least 12 hours to chill a watermelon for best serving. Halves or pieces should be wrapped tightly in wax paper, plastic wrap or plastic bags to prevent cut surface from drying out. This also prevents the aroma of the melon from spreading to other foods in the refrigerator.

Enjoy watermelon, chilled, often now and throughout September. It is one of the few products consumed almost entirely in fresh form. The average American eats an estimated 16 pounds. Be sure to get your share of this refreshing goodness.

Berry Shake
Crush one cup any flavored fresh berries; add one cup chilled milk, one-half pint vanilla ice cream and one-fourth cup honey in a chilled blender or other mixer. Loads of good nutrition.

Among Best Buys
Produce displays are piled high with quality of quality fruits, berries, melons, vegetables. Consumers put "quality perishables" at top of list of what they expect in their food store. They're far more concerned about quality than price; evidently figure that quality foods are worth the price.

Since nature has not equipped fresh vegetables and fruits very well to withstand the rigors of travel from fields and orchards to home kitchens, it has been necessary for grocers, packers, truckers, storekeepers to handle produce with care every step of the way. Not merely care but special care since lettuce for instance requires quite different handling from cantaloupes... both of which are in August abundance.

Lettuce has no protection, not as much as an egg, against bruising or water loss. Lettuce must be handled not only carefully but in a cool atmosphere. Quick cooling is essential to retain harvest-fresh quality of most vegetables. Cool moist air of hydrocooling is used to keep asparagus, lettuce, sweet corn, peas, celery, cabbage, spinach and other greens at 32 degrees.

Humidity Essential
Cantaloupes keep better at 40 degrees; cucumbers, eggplant and green peppers at 45 to 50 degrees; and so it goes.

Forest Service Reports Berries Ripening Quickly

Huckleberries are ripe in the mountains, according to the U.S. forest service.

Prospect and Union Creek ranger districts report a heavy crop of large berries. The August rains and cool weather during formation period have resulted in a better crop this year than there has been in recent years, the forest service said.

The current warm weather is ripening berries rapidly and on-the-ground sources report the berries are sweet and juicy.

The huckleberries are found mostly in openings in the timber along the Umpqua divide and on Huckleberry mountain northeast of Prospect.

Camps Available
Camps are available at such huckleberry spots as Neil Springs, Huckleberry lake, Windy Gap, Huckleberry gap, and Huckleberry city. The week end of Aug. 25 and 26 will see the best picking, with the crop declining rapidly afterward, forest rangers said.

Some picking will still be available the following week end, but it will be spotty. Roads leading to both the Umpqua divide and Huckleberry mountain areas from the Crater Lake highway are in good condition. Quite a bit of passenger car travel is expected over the week end and motorists are cautioned to watch for blind corners.

The forest service also asked residents to be careful with fires, and not to smoke while walking or picking berries. Smokers are advised to sit down and relax in a safe place.

Information on roads, campgrounds, and routes of travel may be obtained at the Union Creek Ranger station from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. seven days a week, and at the Prospect Ranger station from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Lebanon Area Plant Damaged

Lebanon—Fire of undetermined origin leveled part of the Kal-Wood particle board plant nine miles east of here early today, doing damage estimated at about \$40,000.

Fire equipment from the Lebanon and Sweet Home fire departments and the Lincoln County fire patrol kept the flames from spreading to the rest of the mill.

A 40 by 80 foot building which housed a large hammer mill and chip storage facility was destroyed. There were no injuries.

Consumers do not think highly of humidity but it is essential to vegetables. Hydrocooling, packing, icing and plastic film packages are helping to create the humid conditions that protect high quality in vegetables.

Since practically every known vegetable is in August abundance, we'll not name them here. Fruitful plants include Gravenstein apples, avocados, bananas, grapes, lemons, melons of all kinds, nectarines, oranges, peaches, Bartlett pears, plums.

Frozen concentrated orange juice is a good buy. All it needs is a good shaking! Air and water are both removed from the fresh juice when it is concentrated; both need to be returned if sparkle and flavor are to be reviewed. Shake vigorously in a shaker, tightly lidded jar (a well stoppered milk bottle will do) or aerate by pouring back and forth from wide mouthed jar to pitcher. Keep those little cans in freezing compartment of your refrigerator to retain vital vitamin C content and full fresh flavor.
